Congressman Bob Dole, 6th District, Kansas - stated that he has had several requests, in response to an earlier announcement, for colored lithographed aerial photographs of servicemen's graves in overseas cemeteries. The American Battle Monuments Commission will provide next-of-kin, of World War II servicemen buried overseas, a colored photograph of the cemetery in which the serviceman is buried together with an attached photograph of the grave site and headstone or, in case of the "Missing", a close-up photograph showing the name inscribed on a memorial wall, Dole said.

"The only information needed", Dole indicated, "is the name, relationship and address of the person making the request, the name of the deceased serviceman and service number, if known."
