Phillipsburg, May 2 - McDill "Huck" Boyd, First District Republican Chairman, in commenting on a recent talk by Fifth District Democratic Congressman, J. Floyd Breeding, said,

A bad case of foot and mouth from which the frightened millionaire at Elkhart is suffering, is obscuring the real farm issues at stake.

Farmers want to know what the Farm Bill will do for Agriculture and he continues to tell fairy tales about penalties and they are fairy tales. He has told them so long he is stuck with them. It started back in February when the U.S.D.A. Farm Bill was alive with new and harsh penalties, including jail sentences to one year and fines up to five thousand dollars, but Breeding denied this as false and misleading. At intervals since, he has continued to deny it, even though the Chief Counsel for the Department publicly admitted that new penalties were in the bill.

But the man talked it off at Salina the other day when he accused Bob Dole of "misleading and false statements about these penalties".

"The facts are", Boyd said, "that Bob led the fight to knock the penalties out of the bill. He has succeeded in getting rid of some of the penalties but many new and strict controls are still there."

Breeding also had the gall to send out a publicity release which stated in the first paragraph there were no new penalties and then took two full pages to try to tell why they wouldn't bother anyone. At Salina he also said that he is opposed to mandatory controls. Brother! - what a fable!

In Committee where legislation is really formed, he has voted for every mandatory control asked by Mr. Freeman, but back home he tries to forget how he voted in Washington, and it's time to call him to account. He won't like it....but his bedtime stories will be fully exposed.
