DOLE WILL CONTINUE TO PRESS FOR COMPROMISE

WASHINGTON, D.C.—"It appears we have an energy shortage here in the Senate,"
Senator Bob Dole said following adjournment of the Senate Finance Committee because
a quorum was not present.

Dole had planned to introduce an amendment intended to strike a compromise between Congressional members opposing any oil tariffs at all and the President's three-step oil tariff plan. The Dole amendment would allow the first, \$1 per barrel increase to remain in effect and then suspend any further oil import tax increases until May 1. Under the \$1 per barrel duty, the price of gasoline is expected to rise 1¢ to 2¢ per gallon.

"There was some support among those Committee members present today," Dole said. "If a quorum is present tomorrow perhaps a compromise can be agreed upon, thereby avoiding more delay or an eventual confrontation between Congress and the President—a confrontation the country doesn't need and can't afford. The suspension of further increases until May 1 would give us an opportunity to develop a comprehensive energy solution agreeable to Congress and the President."
