ALAN KING, HELEN REDDY, LORNE GREEN HEADLINE ENTERTAINMENT  
FOR DEC. 2 HUMPHREY DINNER/FUND RAISER

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Comedian Alan King, singing star Helen Reddy and actor Lorne Green will headline the entertainment at the Dec. 2 dinner/fund raiser for the Hubert H. Humphrey Institute of Public Affairs to be held at the Washington Hilton Hotel.

The announcement came in a Capitol Hill news conference with Sen. Robert Dole (R-Kan.), actress Elizabeth Taylor (dinner planning chairperson) and Mrs. Frances Humphrey Howard, Senator Humphrey's sister.

Hollywood producer Jeff Wald, who arranged for the entertainers to appear, told a West Coast audience today that other prominent entertainers are also expected to attend. He said a guest list will be announced later.

The formal launching of the multi-million dollar fund-raising drive will be the Dec. 2 banquet at the Washington Hilton Hotel. Contributions are fully tax deductible and will be used to set up the Hubert H. Humphrey Institute of Public Affairs at the University of Minnesota.

Funny man Alan King will keep the crowd laughing with his humorous routines, Helen Reddy will be singing songs from her million-seller albums, and the versatile Lorne Green is expected to do an original work by talented Sammy Kahn, reknowned lyricist.

Vice President Walter Mondale and the U.S. Senate leadership, Majority Leader Robert Byrd (D-W. Va.) and Minority Leader Howard Baker (R-Tenn.), had earlier announced the long range fund-raising drive.

The Humphrey Institute was conceived to recognize and honor one of America's best known elected officials and a true humanitarian.

The national fund-raising drive, being conducted by the Univeristy of Minnesota's Foundation, is aiming at July 1, 1978, as the proposed dedication date for the Institute.

Located on the Minneapolis campus of the University of Minnesota, Humphrey's alma mater, the Institute will pay tribute to the man whose legacy to this nation includes the Civil Rights Act, the Peace Corps, the Job Corps, Medicare and the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty.

In addition to housing for the Institute, plans include professorial chair additions; graduate fellowships; public service internships, lectureships by national and governmental officials, planners and professionals; a curator for the Humphrey Archives and Library Collection; a working office for Senator Humphrey; research funds for grants to faculty and advanced students needing support for projects in public policy and planning research; and Public Affairs Forums.
