DOLE INTERVIEWED BY 'JAPAN'S WALTER CRONKITE' ON U.S.-JAPAN TRADE RELATIONS

WASHINGTON-- Senator Bob Dole (R.-Kansas) was interviewed Friday by Jiro Tokuyama, a distinguished Japanese journalist who has been called "the Walter Cronkite of Japan," concerning U.S.-Japanese trade relations and agricultural imports and exports.

Tokuyama is currently taping a special television program to be shown in Japan in a few weeks. Dole was the only Republican Senator interviewed for the program.

"We selected Senator Dole because of his position as ranking Republican on the Senate Finance Committee and because of his reputation as one of America's leading experts on foreign trade and agriculture," said Tokuyama.
