KANSAS SENATORS DOLE, KASSEBAUM SECURE \$6,130,000 FOR 24 STATE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS -- JOBS BILL PAYS OFF FOR KANSANS.

WASHINGTON -- Kansas Senators Bob Dole and Nancy Kassebaum announced today that \$6,130,000 in federal funds is heading to 24 Kansas towns and counties for community improvement proposals ranging from job training and construction projects, to summer youth employment and the removal of architectural barriers to the handicapped.

The Senators said the federal block grants have been secured from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development as part of the 1983 Jobs Bill signed into law by President Reagan in March.

"This is welcome economic news for our state," the Senators said. "We are pleased that our persistence with these grant requests has paid off. Obviously, there has been tremendous national competition for the Jobs Bill money, so we're delighted Kansas has been awarded this sum."

The primary objective of the Community Development Block Grant Program is to help provide decent housing and a suitable living enviornment and expending economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate income. Accordingly, communities apply for a wide array of projects that will help reach these social goals.
