FARM CREDIT MEETING TO BE HELD SENATOR DOLE'S TOPEKA OFFICE TOMORROW

Key Players to Discuss Improvements in Program

WASHINGTON -- Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole today announced that he has arranged for top officials of the Kansas Farm Bureau, the Kansas Bankers Association, the Kansas Farm Credit Banks, and the Farmers Home Administration to discuss improvements in the Reagan Administration's Debt Adjustment Program (DAP) with U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Under Secretary Frank Naylor.

The meeting will take place in Dole's Topeka office, in the Frank Carlson Federal Building, at 11:00 am, Tuesday, April 9.

"The package is designed to provide short-term relief to farmers experiencing credit problems. That is the area in which our efforts should be concentrated," said Dole. "I arranged for the meeting so that all the parties involved could discuss any problems that have become apparent during the implementation of the program. I hope we can improve communication between the key players concerning what is and is not available through the program."
