DOLE: RURAL BUS CARRIERS TO PICK UP ABANDONED GREYHOUND SERVICE

Washington, D.C. -- SENATOR BOB DOLE (R-KS) ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT THREE KANSAS RURAL PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS WILL PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION SERVICE ALONG ROUTES AFFECTED BY THE GREYHOUND ABANDONMENT FRIDAY ON AN AS-NEEDED BASIS. DOLE HAD ASKED GREYHOUND OFFICIALS TUESDAY TO CONTACT RURAL TRANSIT SERVICES OPERATING IN THE AREA ABOUT PICKING UP THE ABANDONED SERVICE IN AN EFFORT TO ASSIST PERSONS AFFECTED BY THE GREYHOUND LINES, INC. ABANDONMENT.

"PERSONS WHO HAVE BEEN RELYING ON GREYHOUND FOR BUS SERVICE ALONG THE ABANDONED ROUTES WILL BE ABLE TO CALL THESE SERVICES AS THEY NEED THEM. THE TRANSPORTATION SERVICES HAVE AGREED TO RESPOND WITH THEIR BEST EFFORTS ON AN AS-AVAILABLE BASIS," SENATOR DOLE SAID.
