

EPA EXPANDING ITS OFFICES IN KANSAS CITY, KS.

WASHINGTON - KANSAS SENATOR BOB DOLE ISSUED THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT TODAY FOLLOWING THE ANNOUNCEMENT BY THE GENERAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION OF EXPANSION OF THE REGIONAL HEADQUARTERS OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY TO ADDITIONAL OFFICE SPACE IN DOWNTOWN KANSAS CITY, KANSAS:

"The announcement of this competitive award again shows that Kansas City, Kansas, remains committed to bringing new vigor to downtown and that the Federal Government knows a good deal when it sees one. With the expanded responsibilities of the EPA, this will enable the additional staff to be consolidated in one location," said Dole.

"Unfolding in the Minnesota Avenue - State Avenue corridor, we have the Regional Headquarters of HUD, a new Federal Courthouse and office complex under construction, and this expansion of EPA. This is becoming a top-notch hub for Federal offices and a home base for Federal employees. I challenge the regional business community to better that record - and at the same time join our KCK leaders in recognizing the teamwork and dedication required to move forward this far in the downtown revitalization process," Dole added.

The EPA, headquartered at 726 Minnesota, will expand to 36,000 square feet of adjoining office space leased in the building owned by the International Brotherhood of Boilermakers.
