WYANDOTTE HOUSE IN LINE FOR \$750,000;
DOLE AND KASSEBAUM'S REQUEST APPROVED TODAY

WASHINGTON - At the request of Senate Republican Leader Bob Dole (R-Ks) and Senator Nancy Kassebaum (R-Ks), the Senate Appropriations Committee today agreed to fund a \$750,000 grant for the Wyandotte House, a treatment center and shelter for abused, emotionally impaired and runaway children, located in Kansas City, Kansas. The full committee completed action on the FY 1992 V.A., H.U.D. and Independent Agencies Appropriations bill. The HUD Special Purposes Grant would be used to help fund the construction of a new Children's Center.

"This outstanding center has served as an invaluable, and in many cases, life-saving shelter for more than 900 children since it opened it's doors. Education programs, mental health and social services, and day-to-day care are critically important to children that have been denied a happy and loving home," said Dole.

"With a new center, this facility will be able to help even more children. I'm pleased that the Committee feels this program should continue serving the people of Kansas and Wyandotte County," Senator Kassebaum said.

The bill now goes to the full Senate for approval.
