WASHINGTON - The U.S. Senate today approved a proposal to grant the City of Wichita \$1 million to fight crime and gang violence. Kansas Senators Dole and Kassebaum sponsored the amendment which was included in the Department of Commerce, State, and Justice Appropriations bill for the coming fiscal year. The Senate completed action on the bill today. The measure now goes to a joint House\Senate conference committee to work out the differences between the two bills.

Elma Broadfoot, the mayor of Wichita, met with Dole and Kassebaum earlier this week regarding the city's interest in seeking assistance to combat the city's gang violence.

"After talking with the mayor, I believe that Wichita is an ideal site for this innovative pilot program to help fight violence in our cities. Wichita is determined to take an aggressive approach in combating gang violence and by working together, community volunteers, civic leaders, and law enforcement officials will be able to clean up our neighborhoods, help keep young kids off the streets, and make city streets safe again," said Dole.
