1993 WINTER WHEAT CROP DISASTER ELIGIBILITY EXTENDED

WASHINGTON - Kansas Senator Bob Dole announced today that those farmers who were prevented from planting wheat last fall are now eligible for disaster payments under the 1993 disaster bill.

Dole contacted the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) after hearing numerous concerns from many Kansas farmers about disaster payment eligibility requirements. USDA had originally declared that those farmers who were prevented from planting wheat last fall would <u>not</u> be eligible for 1993 disaster payments.

"I'm pleased that USDA has decided to change this regulation and enable more farmers to be eligible for disaster payments. When devastating weather strikes, it's important to respond sensibly to those who have been affected," said Dole.

The funding for 1993 disaster payments is included in the Emergency Supplemental Appropriations bill (the so-called disaster bill) that Congress passed this August to assist those affected earlier this year by severe flooding and other extreme weather conditions throughout the Midwest.

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
