FARRAKHAN & LION MAN MARCH STATEMENT OF SENATE MAJORITY LEADER BOB DOLE

Fort Lauderdale, FL -- Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole today made the following statement:

"If you want to talk about anti-Semitism, it's written all over Louis Farrakhan. That's his message of hate.

"My view is, there are probably a lot of well-intentioned people coming to Washington. And I like the talk about self-reliance, about picking yourself up, cleaning up our cities and getting kids off drugs, but I don't think that Farrakhan should be the leader of the march. His anti-Semitic slurs continue to prove that he has no place posing as a moral leader. He spreads suspicion, separatism, and hate wherever he goes. No cloak can cover the ugliness of Farrakhan's purpose. So my view is, if he would just leave the march, it would be better off."
