DOLE INTRODUCES JOHN THOMAS MARTEN OF MCPHERSON AT SENATE CONFIRMATION HEARING

WASHINGTON - Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole today introduced John Thomas Marten of McPherson, Kansas, at his confirmation hearing before the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee. Marten has been nominated to the U.S. District Court for Kansas:

I am pleased to introduce John Thomas Marten of McPherson, Kansas.

Tom and his wife, the former Mary Tessendorf, graduated from high school in Onaga, Kansas. I have known the Tessendorf family in the Onaga community for many years.

Like me, Tom is a graduate of Washburn University Law School in Topeka, Kansas. Unlike me, Tom is actually putting that legal education to use.

Tom brings substantial experience to the federal bench. He has appeared frequently in court since joining the McPherson law firm of Bremyer & Wise in 1981. His primary focus has been litigation, emphasizing criminal defense and plaintiff personal injury.

The high regard for his professional capabilities is reflected in the praise offered by those who know him best. Bob Wise, senior partner in the firm and a long-time friend of mine, is present today.
