HE BECAME A REGULAR ON THE WHITE SOX TEAM IN 1965 AND AS A ROOKIE LED THE AMERICAN LEAGUE IN PUTOUTS. KEN IS ONE OF THE FINEST FIELDERS IN BASEBALL TODAY, AND THOSE OF YOU
