IT IS A PLEASURE TO BE WITH YOU AGAIN TO MARK ANOTHER MILESTONE
IN OUR CONTINUING EFFORTS TO PROVIDE WATER SERVICE TO OUR POST
ROCK COMMUNITY. I AM PARTICULARLY PROUD TO RECOGNIZE THE SPIRIT
OF COOPERATION AND DETERMINATION OF SO MANY WHICH HAS CARRIED US
THIS FAR.

ADOLPH VOPAT, MELVIN WEBB, AND THE OTHER MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS -- BOB WHITMER, DWIGHT SPERRY, HENRY BENDER, LEROY CHARVAT, BOB DIERS, LARRY KILIAN, LEE ROSS -- HAVE GIVEN AN ENORMOUS AMOUNT OF TIME AND ATTENTION TO THIS PROJECT SINCE THE IDEA SURFACED BACK IN 1976. BOB WHITMER, CURRENT CHAIRMAN, HAS HAD A MAJOR RESPONSIBILITY IN ENCOURAGING THE GROUP AS WE STRUGGLED WITH GAINING THE ATTENTION OF THE FARMERS HOME ADMINISTRATION, SELLING MEMBERSHIPS, SECURING EASEMENTS, AND AWARDING CONTRACTS.

INDIVIDUAL USERS FOR THIS PHASE ALONE REPRESENTS A MONUMENTAL

UNDERTAKING.

KANAPOLIS LAKE, SINCE IT BEGAN TO FILL IN 1948, HAS COME TO MEAN FLOOD CONTROL, BOATING, AND FISHING TO US HERE IN THE HEART OF KANSAS. SHORTLY, IT WILL SERVE AS A SOURCE OF CLEAN, SAFE WATER FOR OUR HOMES, IN WHAT LARRY DAVIS AND THE FARMERS HOME PEOPLE HAVE CALLED THE LARGEST RURAL WATER DISTRICT IN KANSAS, IN TERMS OF THE TOTAL AREA ENCOMPASSED BY THE BOUNDARIES WHICH SPREAD THROUGH EIGHT COUNTIES.

THAT BRINGS US TO TODAY'S AGENDA -- MARKING A SIGNIFICANT
STEP AS ACTUAL CONSTRUCTION BEGINS. THE PAPERS ARE SIGNED, THE
SHOVELS ARE READY. GIVEN THE NATURE AND PROFESSIONAL REPUTATION

OF THE ENGINEERS AND CONTRACTORS WHO ARE IN CHARGE, IT IS REASONABLE
TO EXPECT THAT YOU WILL BE ABLE TO REACH YOUR GOAL -- TO BEGIN
PUMPING WATER BY THIS TIME NEXT YEAR. THANK YOU FOR INVITING ME.

It is a pleasure to be with you again to mark another milestone in our continuing efforts to provide water service to our Post Rock community. I am particularly proud to recognize the spirit of cooperation and determination of so many which has carried us this far.

Adolph Vopat, Melvin Webb, and the other members of the Board of Directors--Bob Whitmer, Dwight Sperry, Henry Bender, Leroy Charvat, Bob Diers, Larry Kilian, Lee Ross--have given an enormous amount of time and attention to this project since the idea surfaced back in 1976. Bob Whitmer, current Chairman, has had a major responsibility in encouraging the group as we struggled with gaining the attention of the Farmers Home Administration, selling memberships, securing easements, and awarding contracts.

It is particularly significant that six cities have signed up to participate--Brookville, Dorrance, Gorham, Luray, Paradise, & Waldo. Personally contacting and signing on nearly 700 individual users for this phase alone represents a monumental undertaking.

Kanopolis Lake, since it began to fill in 1948, has come to mean flood control, boating, and fishing to us here in the Heart of Kansas. Shortly, it will serve as a source of clean, safe water for our homes, in what Larry Davis and the Farmers Home people have called the largest rural water district in Kansas, in terms of the total area encompassed by the boundaries which spread through eight counties.


That brings us to today's agenda--marking a significant step as actual construction begins. The papers are signed, the shovels are ready. Given the nature and professional
