IMPORTANCE OF AGRICULTURE

DANIEL WEBSTER ONCE SAID, "LET US NEVER FORGET THAT THE

CULTIVATION OF THE EARTH IS THE MOST IMPORTANT LABOR OF MAN."

EVEN THOUGH FARMERS REPRESENT ONLY THREE PERCENT OF OUR

POPULATION, THAT STATEMENT IS AS TRUE TODAY AS WHEN IT WAS FIRST

SAID 144 YEARS AGO.

THAT ONE FARMER PRODUCES ENOUGH FOOD TO FEED HIMSELF AND 80 OTHER PEOPLE. YOU CAN BE PROUD THAT AGRICULTURE PROVIDES EMPLOYMENT FOR 24 MILLION AMERICANS OR ONE IN EVERY FIVE JOBS. YOU CAN BE PROUD THAT AGRICULTURE WILL PROVIDE A POSITIVE BALANCE OF TRADE TO THE TUNE OF \$20 BILLION THIS YEAR. BECAUSE OF YOU, AMERICANS SPEND ONLY 17 PERCENT OF THEIR AFTER-TAX INCOME ON FOOD. THERE'S NO QUESTION ABOUT IT: THE AMERICAN FARMER IS BOTH THE WONDER AND THE ENVY OF THE WORLD. AND PEOPLE EVERYWHERE SHOULD BE GRATEFUL FOR HIS ACCOMPLISHMENTS — AND CONCERNED ABOUT HIS FUTURE.

WORKING WITH GOVERNMENT

A CHARACTER IN THE BOOK GULLIVER'S TRAVELS MAKES THE

STATEMENT: "THAT WHOEVER COULD MAKE TWO EARS OF CORN, OR TWO

BLADES OF GRASS, TO GROW UPON A SPOT OF GROUND WHERE ONLY ONE

GREW BEFORE, WOULD DESERVE BETTER OF MANKIND, AND DO MORE

ESSENTIAL SERVICE TO HIS COUNTRY, THAN THE WHOLE RACE OF POLITICIANS PUT TOGETHER."

THIS IS NOT THE TIME NOR PLACE FOR PARTISANSHIP. IT IS,

RATHER, AN OPPORTUNITY TO CELEBRATE TEAMWORK. THE PRESIDENT HAS

SAID THAT AMERICA IS BACK - WE'VE GONE BACK TO BASIC VALUES
WE'RE BACK ON TRACK ECONOMICALLY - AND MILLIONS OF US HAVE GONE

BACK TOO WORK. INTEREST RATES AND INFLATION ARE BOTH FALLING

BACK UNDER CONTROL. AND MOST IMPORTANT OF ALL, AMERICANS ARE

ONE MORE EXAMPLE OF THE SUPPORT REQUIRED IF YOUNG PEOPLE ARE TO
DEVELOP THEIR TALENTS AND REALIZE THEIR POTENTIAL. AND IF IT'S
TRUE, AS ELIZABETH TELLS ME IT IS, "THAT BESIDE EVERY GOOD MAN
STANDS A GOOD WOMAN," THEN IT'S ALSO TRUE THAT BESIDE EVERY GOOD
FFA MEMBER STANDS SOME VERY FINE PARENTS.

OF COURSE THE KEY TO THIS WINNING TEAM ARE THE FFA MEMBERS

THEMSELVES -- 450,000 STRONG IN OVER 8,000 FFA CHAPTERS. YOU

HOLD IN YOUR HANDS A PRICELESS TREASURE, A SIX LETTER WORD THAT

HOW CAN WE DO THAT?

FIRST, WE CAN DO IT BY PASSING A 1985 FARM BILL THAT REDUCES

OVERALL GOVERNMENT OUTLAYS WHILE ENCOURAGING FARMER PROFITABILITY

AND STRENGTHENING EXPORTS. THESE DAYS, THERE ARE SEVERE LIMITS

ON GOVERNMENT'S FINANCIAL RESOURCES - AND YET THERE ARE NO LIMITS

ON INDIVIDUAL EFFORT OR NATIONAL IMAGINATION. IF WE APPLY A

LITTLE OF BOTH, WE CAN ACCOMPLISH THE SINGLE MOST IMPORTANT THING

THAT WOULD HELP THE FARMER - INCLUDING FARMERS OF YOUR GENERATION - TO ACHIEVE LASTING PROSPERITY IN A HEALTHY ECONOMY.

MUCH OF THE DISCUSSION AS WE WRITE FARM LEGISLATION WILL NO
DOUBT CENTER ON THE ISSUE OF COMPETITIVENESS. OBVIOUSLY, YOU

CAN'T REMAIN COMPETITIVE ABROAD IF YOU RESORT TO SELF-DEFEATING

MEASURES LIKE GRAIN EMBARGOES - OR IF YOU TOLERATE WITHOUT

RESPONSE FOREIGN SUBSIDIES AND AN OVERVALUED U.S. DOLLAR.

THE PRESIDENT HAS MADE IT PLAIN THAT HE WILL NEVER RESORT TO

AN EMBARGO TO MAKE A POLITICAL POINT. NOW THE TIME HAS COME TO

GET TO WORK ON REDRESSING THE IMBALANCE OF TRADE. AND THAT MEANS

DOING SOMETHING SIGNIFICANT TO REDUCE OUR OWN BUDGET DEFICIT,

WHICH WOULD LOWER INTEREST RATES AND IMPROVE THE COMPETITIVE

CLIMATE FOR FARM PRODUCTS OVERSEAS. WE CAN CONVENE TALKS ON

FOREIGN TRADE. WE CAN SUBSIDIZE THIS CROP OR PROMOTE THAT ONE.

BUT NONE OF THESE STEPS BY THEMSELVES CAN BEGIN TO MATCH THE

IMPORTANCE OF CONTROLLING OUR OWN URGE AS A GOVERNMENT TOO SPEND MORE THAN WE TAKE IN.

NOW A BUDGET HAS BEEN DEFINED AS AN ORDERLY SYSTEM OF LIVING BEYOND YOUR MEANS. IN WASHINGTON, THOUGH, IT'S NOT EVEN VERY ORDERLY -- JUST PROFLIGATE. TRUE, THINGS HAVE GOTTEN BETTER SINCE RONALD REAGAN TOOK OFFICE. THE ANNUAL RATE OF BUDGETARY GROWTH HAS BEEN CUT IN HALF. UNCLE SAM'S BEEN PUT ON A DIET, BEFORE HE EATS ALL OF US OUT OF HOUSE AND HOME. BUT THE OLD MAN IS STILL GROSSLY OVERWEIGHT.

NOW CONGRESS DID MANAGE TO PASS A DEFICIT REDUCTION PLAN LAST YEAR, A DOWN PAYMENT THAT WILL DRAIN OFF PERHAPS \$150 BILLION WORTH OF THAT RED INK OVER THE NEXT THREE YEARS. IT'S A START, AND A SIGNAL TO THE FINANCIAL MARKETS THAT WE MEANT BUSINESS, EVEN IN AN ELECTION YEAR. BUT IT'S ONLY A START -- AND THE TIME TO BEGIN CHOPPING DOWN THE REMAINING DEFICIT IS NOW.

EACH DAY OF DELAY REPRESENTS A RISK TO YOUR FUTURE

PROSPERITY. DEFICITS THAT ANNUALLY APPROACH \$200 BILLION WOULD

THREATEN OUR SPECTACULAR ECONOMIC RECOVERY BY REKINDLING

INFLATION AND KEEPING INTEREST RATES HIGH, WITH THE RESULT BEING

FEWER JOBS FOR YOUR GENERATION.

TO ACCOMPLISH THE TASK OF DEFICIT REDUCTION, WE WILL TAKE A CLOSE LOOK AT ALL BUDGET CUTTING POSSIBILITIES. THERE ARE NO SACRED COWS ON THE FARM AND WE CAN'T HAVE ANY IN THE FEDERAL BUDGET EITHER.

THE VOICE RINGING THROUGH BOTH COUNTRYSIDE AND CITY ALIKE IS
CALLING FOR ACTION NOW. PRESIDENT REAGAN AND THE CONGRESS CAN DO
THE JOB WITH A LITTLE LUCK, A LOT OF STATESMANSHIP, AND, OF
COURSE, HARD WORK. AMERICA, AND THE FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA,
STAND ON THE THRESHOLD OF TOMORROW AND ITS WINDOW OF OPPORTUNITY
IS WIDE OPEN. WITH YOUR HELP, WE'LL SECURE A FUTURE THAT IS

FFA TALKING POINTS

- o This is the 57th Annual National Convention of the FFA. The convention crowd is expected to be about 23,000 members and guests.
- This year's national president, Ron Wineinger, is from Marion, Kansas. Other officers are: Bill Caraway, New Mexico; Rhonda Scheulen, Missouri; Melody Lawson, Arizona; Carol Irvine, Maryland; and Chuck Duggar, Florida. New officers will be elected at this year's convention.
- o FFA Theme: "Keep agriculture number 1, support vocational agriculture and FFA."
- O The FFA is a national organization with approximately 470,000 members in over 8000 FFA chapters across the nation.

GENERAL AG POINTS

- O Agriculture is the nation's biggest industry. Agriculture employs 24 million people in this country.
- o One farmer produces enough for himself and 80 other Americans.
- O U.S. ag exports are estimated to be \$38 billion in 1985.
- O Americans spend less than 17% of our disposable income on food, compared to 70% in some countries.

1985 FARM BILL POINTS

- O Agriculture's basic problem is the same today as in the 1920's -excess supplies and low prices.
- O The farm bill will be addressed with sensitivity to large outlays for recent programs. Costs have risen from \$4 billion to \$19 billion last year. PIK was valued at an additional \$9 billion cost.
- o Initiatives passed in the 1985 farm bill will likely influence the agriculture environment of many FFA members at this conference.
- Macroeconomic issues have become just as important in impacting agriculture as farm programs. High interest rates raise production costs for farmers and lead to a strong dollar which reduces ag exports.
- O New legislation will want to be flexible to address long-range concerns.
- Much discussion will focus on how to remain competitive in world markets. Other countires have become increasingly competitive in recent years as the U.S. has lost markets due to embargoes, a strong dollar, and foreign subsidies.

YOU CAN BE VERY PROUD THAT AGRICULTURE WILL PROVIDE A POSITIVE BALANCE OF TRADE TO THE TUNE OF \$20 BILLION THIS YEAR. YET, AMERICANS SPEND ONLY 17 PERCENT OF THEIR AFTER-TAX INCOME ON FOOD. YOU CAN BE VERY PROUD THAT THE AMERICAN FARMER IS BOTH THE WONDER AND THE ENVY OF THE WORLD. AND PEOPLE EVERYWHERE SHOULD BE CONCERNED ABOUT FARMERS IF THEY EAT FOOD.

WORKING WITH GOVERNMENT

A CHARACTER IN THE BOOK <u>GULLIVER'S TRAVELS</u> MADE THE STATEMENT:
"THAT WHOEVER COULD MAKE TWO EARS OF CORN, OR TWO BLADES OF GRASS,

PERHAPS THAT'S TRUE. BEING IN WASHINGTON 24 YEARS, THERE

HAVE BEEN TIMES WHEN I'VE WONDERED IF POLITICIANS ARE LEADING THEIR

CONSTITUENTS OR BEING CHASED BY THEM! I'VE OFTEN SAID, IN REFERRING

TO POLITICAL LEADERS: "JUDGE US BY WHAT WE DO AND NOT WHAT WE SAY."

I MENTIONED A MOMENT AGO THAT AGRICULTURE IS OUR COUNTRY'S MOST

IMPORTANT INDUSTRY. BECAUSE YOU REPRESENT ITS FUTURE, YOU HAVE A

VITAL STAKE IN WHAT YOUR POLITICAL LEADERS DO OR FAIL TO DO.

A FEW SHORT YEARS AGO, THE AMERICAN FARMER WAS SEVERELY HURT
BY THE RUSSIAN GRAIN EMBARGO. IT WRECKED OUR MARKETS AND TARNISHED
OUR IMAGE AS A RELIABLE SUPPLIER OF FOOD. INTEREST RATES AT
21.5 PERCENT AND DOUBLE DIGIT INFLATION WERE CHOKING FARMERS. WHEN
RONALD REAGAN CAME INTO OFFICE, HE ENDED THE GRAIN EMBARGO AND
SINCE THAT TIME WE HAVE BEGUN TO REGAIN OUR SHARE OF THE SOVIET
MARKET. BUT IT TAKES A LONG TIME TO REVERSE THE EFFECTS OF A BAD
POLICY.

IN THE LAST FOUR YEARS WE HAVE BROUGHT INTEREST RATES DOWN TO

12 PERCENT AND HAVE REDUCED INFLATION TO ABOUT FOUR PERCENT. THE

ARE ESPECIALLY IMPORTANT FIGURES FOR YOUNG FARMERS. THE AMERICAN

FARMER HAS PROVEN HE CAN PRODUCE, BUT THE OTHER SIDE OF THE COIN

IS THAT WE MUST ALSO MARKET, EXPORT AND DISTRIBUTE OUR PRODUCTS
IN ORDER FOR AGRICULTURE TO BE SUCCESSFUL. THAT REQUIRES YOUR
PARTICIPATION TO INSURE THAT GOVERNMENT WORKS FOR FARMERS AND
NOT AGAINST THEM.

MANY OF YOU ARE APPROACHING THE AGE WHEN YOU CAN VOTE AND SOME OF YOU DID JUST A FEW DAYS AGO. YOUR COLLECTIVE VOICE CAN MAKE A POSITIVE IMPACT FOR THE GOOD OF AGRICULTURE. NO ONE IN THIS ROOM TODAY COULD URGE YOU TOO STRONGLY TO PARTICIPATE IN OUR POLITICAL SYSTEM. PARTICIPATION IN THE DEMOCRATIC PROCESS IS ONE OF YOUR GREATEST PRIVILEDGES AND ONE OF YOUR MOST IMPORTANT RESPONSIBILITIES. MANY WHO HAVE GONE BEFORE YOU HAVE FOUGHT FOR, SUFFERED BECAUSE OF, AND DIED FOR YOUR RIGHT TO PARTICIPATE IN A FREE SOCIETY.

A FINAL CHALLENGE

YOU'VE HAD A VERY GOOD OPPORTUNITY THIS WEEK TO LEARN ABOUT AGRICULTURE, YOURSELVES AND OTHER PEOPLE. IT IS LIKELY THAT YOU

HAVE LISTENED TO SEVERAL INSPIRING SPEAKERS. BUT THE CHALLENGE IS
BOTH FOR THE SPEAKERS AND THE AUDIENCE IT IS UP TO YOU TO TAKE
WHAT A SPEAKER SAYS ON A GIVEN DAY AND APPLY IT. NOT JUST FOR
THAT DAY, BUT EVERY DAY. NOT JUST FOR A WEEK OR A YEAR, BUT FOR
A LIFETIME.

THE IMPORTANT POINT ABOUT YOUR FUTURE AS YOUNG PEOPLE, IS THAT YOU WILL HAVE GREAT OPPORTUNITIES TO MAKE YOUR LIVES AND YOUR ACTIONS REALLY COUNT. ALONG WITH THE OPPORTUNITIES YOU ARE LIKELY TO FIND YOUR SHARE OF ADVERSITY. SOME PEOPLE SEE ADVERSITY AND BACK DOWN, WHILE OTHERS SEE OBSTACLES AS MOUNTAINS WHICH CAN ELEVATE THEM TO NEW HEIGHTS. MY CHALLENGE FOR YOU IS TO REMEMBER THAT YOU CAN'T DETERMINE THE LENGTH OF YOUR LIFE, BUT YOU CAN DETERMINE ITS WIDTH AND ITS DEPTH.
