VISIT OF NATIONAL PEOPLE'S CONGRESS DELEGATION  
LUNCHEON TOAST  
SEPTEMBER 19, 1985

VICE CHAIRMAN WANG (wahng), SECRETARY GENERAL WANG (wahng),  
VICE CHAIRMAN HUAN (hwahn), MEMBERS OF THE DELEGATION,  
LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

I WANT TO REITERATE THE WELCOME WHICH I EXTENDED TO YOU  
ON THE SENATE FLOOR YESTERDAY. IT'S A GREAT PERSONAL  
PLEASURE TO HAVE YOU HERE.

WHEN WE WERE IN CHINA, CHAIRMAN DENG XIAOPING (dung  
shao-ping) PREDICTED THAT GREATER MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN OUR COUNTRIES WOULD YIELD EVEN CLOSER FRIENDSHIP  
BETWEEN OUR PEOPLES. TO THAT END, HE INVITED MORE MEMBERS  
OF OUR CONGRESS TO VISIT CHINA.

I SHARE CHAIRMAN DENG'S VIEWPOINT, SO I REGARD YOUR  
VISIT WITH US AS A SIGNIFICANT LANDMARK IN OUR BILATERAL  
RELATIONS. DURING YOUR STAY, YOU CAN GAIN MORE  
UNDERSTANDING OF OUR GOVERNMENTAL SYSTEM AND OUR COUNTRY IN  
GENERAL. AND I AM CONFIDENT THAT FROM THAT GREATER  
UNDERSTANDING WILL EVOLVE EVEN MORE RESPECT AND GOODWILL  
BETWEEN US.

VICE CHAIRMAN WANG (wahng), SECRETARY GENERAL WANG (wahng),  
VICE CHAIRMAN HUAN (hwan), MEMBERS OF THE DELEGATION, LADIES  
AND GENTLEMEN:

JUST UNDER FOUR WEEKS AGO, OUR OWN DELEGATION ARRIVED IN  
CHINA. DURING OUR BRIEF STAY, WE LEARNED A GREAT DEAL ABOUT  
YOUR SYSTEM AND COUNTRY.

WE'RE VERY PLEASED THAT YOU NOW HAVE THIS CHANCE TO SEE  
FOR YOURSELVES HOW OUR SYSTEM OPERATES -- OUR FEDERAL  
GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE HERE IN WASHINGTON, OUR STATE AND LOCAL  
GOVERNMENTS, AND THE SITUATION IN CITIES, TOWNS AND FARMING  
AREAS AROUND THE COUNTRY.

I'M ESPECIALLY HAPPY THAT YOU'LL BE GOING TO KANSAS. AS  
AN IMPARTIAL OBSERVER, I CAN GUARANTEE YOU'LL FIND SOME OF  
THE GREATEST PEOPLE IN OUR COUNTRY THERE.

OURS IS A PECULIAR SYSTEM -- I DON'T THINK THERE'S  
ANOTHER LIKE IT IN THE WORLD. BUT WE'RE PROUD OF IT, AND WE  
THINK IT WORKS. WE'VE GOT VERY BIG PROBLEMS -- OUR BUDGET  
AND TRADE DEFICITS COME TO MIND AS TWO OF THE BIGGEST -- BUT

WE REMAIN CONFIDENT THAT WE CAN TACKLE THEM.

AND OUR COUNTRIES, THOUGH DIFFERENT IN MANY WAYS, HAVE THAT IN COMMON -- WE HAVE GREAT CHALLENGES, BUT WE'RE TACKLING THOSE CHALLENGES WITH VIGOR AND WITH SUCCESS.

AND WE ARE FINDING, INCREASINGLY, THAT WE CAN DEAL BETTER WITH OUR OWN CHALLENGES WHEN WE COOPERATE. OUR INVESTMENT AND TRADE RELATIONSHIPS ARE MUTUALLY BENEFICIAL AND CAN BE MADE EVEN BETTER. WE HAVE MANY SIMILAR STRATEGIC INTERESTS, AND WE CAN PURSUE SOME OF THEM THROUGH PARALLEL STRATEGIES.

WHILE WE WERE IN BEIJING, YOUR PEOPLE'S CONGRESS CHAIRMAN PENG (pung) TOLD US THAT, IN HIS VIEW, IT WAS INEVITABLE THAT OUR TWO COUNTRIES -- THE WORLD'S MOST DEVELOPED COUNTRY AND THE WORLD'S LARGEST DEVELOPING COUNTRY -- WOULD COOPERATE AND REMAIN FRIENDS. ALL OF US HERE TONIGHT JOIN IN THAT VIEW.

IN THAT SAME SPIRIT, MAY I OFFER A TOAST -- TO THE FRIENDSHIP AND COOPERATION OF OUR COUNTRIES, TO THE HEALTH OF OUR NATIONAL LEADERS AND TO THE PERSONAL RELATIONSHIPS WHICH WE HAVE ESTABLISHED OVER THESE PAST FOUR WEEKS.
