****I am not certain of your past positions on some of the following issues, so please check the points before using.****

o Every year at this time, Republicans all across the country gather to hear politicians at what we call Lincoln Day Dinners.

o Abraham Lincoln, our 16th President, will always be known as one of the best to ever hold the office.

o However, before he became President, he served as one of your predecessors -- as a Postmaster, from May 7, 1833 to May 30, 1836 in the town of New Salem, Illinois.

o The end of Lincoln's service as a postmaster was brought about by the same action that concerns many of you today.

o The Post Office at New Salem was closed so that its service are could be combined with the Post Office at Petersburg.

o Having represented rural areas in Kansas in both the U.S. House of Representatives and in the United States Senate, I know not only of the need to provide for the daily delivery of mail in these areas, but also that the local Post Offices serve as more than a delivery and collection area for mail.

 Post Offices are a gathering place, bringing neighbors together, and fostering discussions and debates over everything from pie recipes to issues before the Congress.

o I believe the principle duty for the Postal Service has always been, and should remain, to provide quality mail service, at reasonable rates, to all Americans, regardless of where they live.
