REMARKS OF SENATOR BOB DOLE

HORATIO ALGER AWARD

AS I UNDERSTAND IT, HORATIO ALGER STORIES ARE
CLASSIC AMERICAN SUCCESS STORIES. AND I GUESS
THERE ARE SOME -- AT LEAST THE PEOPLE WHO

DECIDED THAT I SHOULD RECEIVE THIS AWARD -- WHO
CONSIDER ME A SUCCESS. WELL, IF I HAVE SUCCEEDED,
I GIVE MUCH OF THE CREDIT TO WHERE AND HOW I WAS
RAISED.

I GREW UP IN A SMALL, KANSAS TOWN DURING THE
DUST BOWL DAYS. YES, MY FATHER MANAGED A GRAIN
ELEVATOR AND RAN A CREAM AND EGG BUSINESS. MY
MOTHER TAUGHT SEWING. AND TOGETHER THEY KEPT
US TOGETHER THROUGH TOUGH TIMES. EVEN MOVING
INTO OUR BASEMENT, RENTING OUT THE UPSTAIRS, TO
MAKE ENDS MEET.

FOR THEN, AS NOW, WE WERE RICH IN ALL THE THINGS THAT COUNT IN LIFE. WE HAD LOVE -- FROM FAMILY -- IMMEDIATE AND EXTENDED; WE WERE RICH IN FRIENDSHIP; AND WE WERE RICH IN TRADITIONAL AMERICAN VALUES. IF BOB DOLE IS A HORATIO ALGER, I'VE GOT PLENTY OF COMPANY IN RUSSELL AND EVERY OTHER TOWN IN OUR COUNTRY.

FOR NOW, AS THEN, THERE ARE TWO KINDS OF
EDUCATION IN THIS WORLD. THERE'S THE ONE YOU
GIVE YOURSELF, AND ANOTHER YOU GET FROM
OTHERS. YOU CAN GET AN EDUCATION ON THE FARM
OR IN A FACTORY, IN A SCIENCE LAB OR IN A CHURCH
PEW. MOST OF ALL, IF YOU'RE FROM RUSSELL, KANSAS
YOU CAN GET AN EDUCATION JUST BY LOOKING AT LIFE
AROUND YOU.

WHEN I WAS A BOY, I DIDN'T KNOW THE NAMES OF
MY CONGRESSMAN OR MY SENATORS. BUT WE WERE
BLESSED TO HAVE FRIENDS AND NEIGHBORS WHO
KNEW AND CARED FOR ONE ANOTHER. WHEN TIMES
WERE TOUGH, PEOPLE WERE TOUGHER. WHEN THE
WINDS HOWLED AND PART OF THE PRAIRIE ITSELF WAS
BLOWN AWAY, I COULD BARELY SEE TO DELIVER THE
NEWSPAPERS ON MY PAPER ROUTE. BUT BECAUSE I
CAME

FROM RUSSELL, BECAUSE I CAME FROM KANSAS, I WAS GRANTED A SPECIAL VISION -- ONE WHICH HAS SEEN ME THROUGH ALL THE YEARS SINCE.

BUT AS SPECIAL AS MY HOMETOWN WAS AND IS TO ME, IT IS PIVOTAL BECAUSE OF TWO VERY IMPORTANT PEOPLE. LIKE MOST EVERY ONE HERE TONIGHT, IT WAS MY MOM AN DAD WHO SHAPED MY LIFE MORE THAN ALL OTHERS. AND WHILE I AM RECEIVING THE AWARD TONIGHT, THEY ARE THE ONES WHO, IN LARGE MEASURE, DESERVE IT.

EACH OF THEM HAD A FAVORITE SAYING, LINES I
HEARD REPEATEDLY AS I GREW UP, LINES THAT SUM UP
WHAT THE HORATIO ALGER AWARD IS ALL ABOUT.

MY MOTHER WOULD CHALLENGE US -- AGAIN AND
AGAIN -- WITH HER CONSTANT REMINDER: "CAN'T NEVER
COULD DO ANYTHING."

AND MY FATHER GAVE US ALL THE GUIDANCE WE
NEEDED WHEN HE DIVIDED THE WORLD THIS WAY:
"THERE ARE DOERS AND THERE ARE STEWERS."

WITHOUT MY EVEN KNOWING IT, THOSE WORDS
BECAME FOR ME, AS THEY HAD FOR MY PARENTS AND
THEIR PARENTS BEFORE THEM, A WAY OF LIFE.

IT WAS THAT KIND OF UPBRINGING THAT HELPED A
YOUNG, DISABLED WAR VETERAN GET ON HIS FEET
AGAIN; EVEN WHEN IT SEEMED AN IMPOSSIBLE TASK.
WHETHER IT WAS ACADEMICS OR ATHLETICS, OR THE
BATTLEFIELD OR CAPITOL HILL, THROUGH THEIR WORDS
AND DEEDS THERE WAS NO DOUBT ABOUT HOW YOU

APPROACHED A TASK -- THERE WAS ONLY ONE WAY --
ALL OUT. AND I GUESS, THAT'S HOW HORATIO ALGERS
ARE BORN.

AND THAT CAN BE JUST AS TRUE TODAY -- IN 1988 --
AS IT WAS IN 1923. THE AMERICAN DREAM CAN BE
ACHIEVED. YOUNG MEN AND WOMEN WHO ARE
STARTING THEIR SCHOOLING, THEIR CAREERS RIGHT
NOW HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE OF THEIR LIVES
ANYTHING THEY WISH. WHAT THEY NEED IS THE WILL,
AND

ENCOURAGEMENT. AND AWARDS LIKE THIS, PROVIDE
THAT KIND OF ENCOURAGEMENT. SO, I WANT TO THANK
ALL OF THOSE INVOLVED WITH TONIGHT'S EVENT. IT IS A
HUMBLING AND VERY SATISFYING EXPERIENCE TO BE
INCLUDED IN THE LONG LIST OF OUTSTANDING
AMERICANS WHO HAVE RECEIVED THE HORATIO ALGER
AWARD.

Alger, Horatio (b. Jan. 13, 1832, Chelsea, Mass.—d. July 18, 1899, South Natick), most popular author in the U.S. in the last 30 years of the 19th century and perhaps the most influential writer of his generation. He was the son of a conservative Unitarian minister, Horatio Alger, Sr., who personally supervised his son's early life and saturated it with prayer, study, and discipline. By the age of nine the boy was reading French, Latin, and Greek, and he early showed an interest in writing. At Harvard he distinguished himself in the classics, graduating in 1852.

Alger had always been intended for the ministry by his family, but after leaving Harvard he tried for several years to make a living as a schoolteacher and a contributor to magazines. In 1857, however, he enrolled in the Harvard Divinity School, from which he took his degree in 1860. After a seven-month tour of Europe with two friends, he returned to the U.S. to find that the Civil War was beginning. Alger made two futile attempts to enlist, but was rejected because of asthma, and then became junior associate to his father in his pastorate at South Natick. His first novel, *Marie Bertrand*, an adult book about life in the Paris slums, was serialized in the *New York Weekly* in January-February 1864. His first novel to be published in book form was *Frank's Campaign* (1864), and it was an immediate success.

In 1864 also Alger was ordained and accepted the pulpit of a church in Brewster, Mass. He continued his writing, however, and in 1865 his congregation, feeling that this was ac-

complished at their expense, voted not to re-engage him. In 1866 he moved to New York City, and with the publication of *Ragged Dick; or, Street-Life in New York* (serialized in 1867, published in book form in 1868), a book for boys that was a sensational success, he found the vein that he was to work for the rest of his life.

The success of *Ragged Dick* led to a visit to the Newsboys' Lodging House, a home for foundlings and runaway boys. Alger came to use the home as a base of operations, and for many years he was benefactor and hero to the boys of the institution.

In this atmosphere Alger wrote those stories of poor boys who rose from rags to riches that were to make him famous and contribute the "Alger hero" to the American language. In a steady succession of books, almost alike except for the names of the characters, he preached that by honesty, cheerful perseverance, and hard work, the virtuous lad would have his just reward—though the reward was almost always precipitated by a stroke of good luck. A tour through the West in 1876-77 produced *The Young Miner* (1879), and other books with Western settings.

Alger settled in Brooklyn, N.Y., with his widowed housekeeper, Kate Down, and her two sons, John and Edward, whom in 1894 he adopted.

A bibliography of his works is given in Ralph D. Gardner, *Horatio Alger* (1964).







3. Include company's annual report or financial statement;
4. Relate human interest stories about nominee and his/her company.

COMMUNITY AND COUNTRY CONTRIBUTIONS

1. How is nominee viewed by his/her subordinates? Superiors?
2. What involvement has there been in one's community? Local and/or national level?
3. What contributions has nominee made to benefit his fellow man? His/her country?
4. Is nominee a proper role model for the youth of America? How can this be demonstrated?
5. Comment on nominee's "track record" once an award is bestowed, i.e., does he/she accept the honor never to be heard from again, or is there an interest in getting involved as an active participant and supporting the goals of the organization.

Awardees love America, support its ideals, respect its flag, and believe in the opportunities inherent in America's free enterprise system.

Awardees demonstrate individual initiative and are committed to excellence -- unusual achievements in life having been accomplished through honesty, hard work, self reliance, enthusiasm, and perseverance.

Awardees are dedicated community leaders.

A person should demonstrate a strong commitment to assisting those less fortunate than himself.

Nominees should believe in and support the goals of the organization and the purpose for which it was founded.

Awardees must be an American citizen.

Awardees must be present at the Awards' ceremony in order to receive the Horatio Alger Award.

Note: A successful candidate who is unable to be present the first year he has been selected to receive the Award may be held over the following (one) year.

A nominee unsuccessful in three years' voting is no longer eligible for consideration.
