SECOND, WITH THE DEMOCRATS CONTROLLING BOTH HOUSES OF CONGRESS, CONGRESSIONAL REPUBLICANS WILL ALSO BE IN A POSITION TO BLOCK DEMOCRATIC EFFORTS TO IMPOSE UNNECESSARY AND UNPRODUCTIVE REQUIREMENTS ON THE AMERICAN ECONOMY.

THIRD, WE DO HAVE GOOD PROPOSALS OF OUR OWN. AS AN EXAMPLE, WE BELIEVE CRIME AND DRUGS ARE OUT OF CONTROL, AND THE AMERICAN PEOPLE WANT SOMETHING DONE. THEY ARE SIMPLY ASKING TO BE SAFE AT HOME, SAFE AT SCHOOL AND SAFE AT WORK.

CRIME BILL

SO WE ARE LOOKING AT A PROPOSAL TO EMBARK

ON A MASSIVE PRISON CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM,

IMPLEMENT A NEW COMPUTER BACKGROUND CHECK

ON GUN PURCHASES AND ONCE AND FOR ALL

REIMPOSE THE DEATH PENALTY FOR THOSE

COMMITTING THE MOST HEINOUS CRIMES.

WHEN WE LEARN THAT NEARLY 70% OF CONVICTS COMMIT ADDITIONAL CRIMES WHEN RELEASED FROM THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM, WE BELIEVE THAT PRISON SENTENCES SHOULD BE MADE LONGER, THAT PAROLE SHOULD BE ABANDONED AND THAT ONCE WE GET OUR HANDS ON CRIMINALS, WE SHOULD PUT THEM IN JAIL -- FOR THE FIRST CRIME.

IN THE DRUG BILL WE PASSED JUST LAST YEAR, WE INCLUDED A NEW REPUBLICAN INITIATIVE. IT WOULD, FOR THE FIRST TIME, REQUIRE AN ON-THE-SPOT COMPUTER CHECK FOR EVERY GUN PURCHASE, TO MAKE SURE THAT GUNS ARE NOT BEING SOLD TO CONVICTED FELONS AND OTHERS WHO -- UNDER **EXISTING LAW -- ARE PROHIBITED FROM BUYING GUNS.** WE ENVISION A SYSTEM THAT YOUR DRIVERS LICENSE WOULD BE PUT THROUGH A LITTLE ELECTRONIC DEVICE

CONNECTED TO A CENTRAL COMPUTER, JUST LIKE YOUR CREDIT CARD IS RUN THROUGH AN ELECTRONIC CHECK TO A CENTRAL COMPUTER TO DETERMINE IF YOUR CREDIT IS GOOD. FINALLY, WE HAVE A SERIOUS PRISON OVERCROWDING PROBLEM. BUT WE ALSO HAVE EXCESS MILITARY BASES, WITH MORE BEING CLOSED EACH YEAR. WE OUGHT TO HOUSE PRISONERS AT THOSE BASES, NOT LET THEM PROWL THE STREETS AND PREY ON OUR CHILDREN.

COMPETITIVENESS

THERE IS A NOW WORN OUT PHRASE IN WASHINGTON -- COMPETITIVENESS. BUT REPUBLICANS ARE FOR IT. TO US IT MEANS EASING ANTI-TRUST OBSTACLES SO U.S. COMPANIES CAN JOIN TOGETHER IN NEW VENTURES, IT MEANS REDUCING COST OF LIABILITY BY REFORMING TORT LAWS, IT MEANS EXPLORING WAYS TO ALLOW AN ECONOMIC MEANS TO HAVE FIBER OPTIC CABLE -- CARRYING A WHOLE RANGE OF SERVICES --INTO AMERICAN HOMES

CAMPAIGN REFORM

WE ALSO WANT TO REFORM POLITICAL CAMPAIGNS. THE LAST TIME WE DID IT, WE CREATED PACS. WE THOUGHT THAT WOULD TAKE SPECIAL INTEREST MONEY OUT OF THE PROCESS. BUT NOW WE HAVE A SYSTEM WHERE PACS GIVE MAINLY TO INCUMBENTS, AND THE MAJORITY OF INCUMBENTS ARE NOT REPUBLICANS.

WE WANT TO LET INDIVIDUALS TO GET BACK IN THE PROCESS BY INCREASING THE AMOUNT THEY CAN GIVE. WE WANT TO GET THE CANDIDATE OUT AMONG THE PEOPLE DEBATING THE ISSUES, SO WE WOULD INCREASE THE AMOUNT THAT PARTIES CAN GIVE, FREEING CANDIDATES FROM FUNDRAISING. WE WOULD ALSO CALL FOR STRICT REPORTING OF SOFT MONEY, AND TRY TO END THE CURRENT PROCESS OF VERY WEALTHY INDIVIDUALS SIMPLY BUYING THEMSELVES A SEAT IN CONGRESS WITH SELF-FINANCED ELECTIONS.

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BUDGET

THE WHITE HOUSE HAS BEEN MEETING WITH

CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET LEADERS TO FASHION A

COMPROMISE ON REACHING THE

GRAMM-RUDMAN-HOLLINGS DEFICIT TARGET OF \$100

BILLION. I BELIEVE THEY WILL REACH A BROAD

AGREEMENT THIS WEEK, AND WE WILL MEET THE

TARGET -- THIS YEAR.

BUT IT WILL GET INCREASINGLY DIFFICULT TO REACH A BALANCED BUDGET. THEREFORE, REPUBLICANS HAVE FOR YEARS CALLED FOR A LINE ITEM VETO SO THE PRESIDENT CAN CULL THE PORK OUT OF CONGRESSIONALLY PASSED APPROPRIATIONS BILLS. THIS YEAR, AT THE URGING OF GEORGE BUSH, WE HAVE ALSO MADE AN OFFER TO CHANGE THE WAY A LINE ITEM VETO WORKS, CHANGED IT TO A SO-CALLED "ENHANCED RECISSION" AUTHORITY PATTERNED AFTER AUTHORITY THE PRESIDENT ALREADY HAS.

I HAVE ALSO CALLED ON THE PRESIDENT TO USE THE LINE ITEM VETO AUTHORITY HE ALREADY HAS --AUTHORITY I BELIEVE IS CONTAINED IN THE CONSTITUTION. I WROTE TO GEORGE BUSH AND TOLD HIM HE OUGHT TO TRY IT, AND LET US FIGHT IT OUT IN THE COURTS.

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TAXES

I AGREE WITH THE PRESIDENT THAT TO BALANCE THE BUDGET, WE NEED TO LOOK AT SPENDING CUTS AND NOT NEW TAXES. I DO NOT BELIEVE TAX INCREASES ARE A SUBSTITUTE FOR SPENDING RESTRAINT TO REDUCE THE FEDERAL BUDGET DEFICIT.

I ALSO BELIEVE THAT KEEPING THE LOWER RATES ENACTED IN 1986 IS VERY IMPORTANT, BOTH AS AN ECONOMIC INCENTIVE AND TO CONVINCE TAXPAYERS THAT OUR TAX LAWS ARE FAIR. IN 1987, I INTRODUCED A RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE SENATE THAT WE SHOULD NOT ATTEMPT TO REDUCE THE DEFICIT BY TAMPERING WITH TAX RATES.

THE BUDGET PROPOSED BY PRESIDENT BUSH MAKES GOOD ON HIS CAMPAIGN PROMISES TO MEET THE GRAMM-RUDMAN-HOLLINGS TARGETS WITHOUT RAISING TAXES. SOME DEMOCRATS HAVE INDICATED THAT THE PRICE FOR ENACTING SOME OF THE PRESIDENT'S PROGRAMS, SUCH AS LOWER CAPITAL GAINS TAXES, IS SOME INCOME TAX RATE INCREASES. I BELIEVE THEY WILL FIND THAT WHEN THE PRESIDENT SAID "NO NEW TAXES," HE MEANT IT. THAT INCLUDES EXCISE TAXES, AS WELL AS RATE INCREASES.

MINIMUM WAGE

YOU MAY HAVE HEARD THAT WE ARE DEBATING THE MINIMUM WAGE IN THE SENATE. TODAY, WE HAD TWO VOTES, AND THE DEMOCRATS PREVAILED. SO THEY NOW HAVE A BILL THAT WOULD ELIMINATE AS MANY AS 600,000 JOBS, JOBS NOW HELD BY THE VERY PEOPLE THEY SAY THEY ARE TRYING TO HELP.

WELL, WE ARE JUST NOT GOING TO LET THAT HAPPEN. GEORGE BUSH HAS SAID HE WILL VETO THE DEMOCRATS BILL, AND HE WILL. AND WE HAVE THE VOTES TO SUSTAIN THE VETO -- IN BOTH THE HOUSE AND THE SENATE.

I HOPE, AFTER THIS EXERCISE, DEMOCRATS WILL SIT DOWN WITH US AND AGREE TO THE 90 CENT INCREASE THE PRESIDENT HAS PROPOSED, INCLUDE A MEANINGFUL TRAINING WAGE AND JOIN US IN REALLY HELPING THOSE WHO ARE WORKING AT THE MINIMUM WAGE.

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MANDATED BENEFITS

MINIMUM WAGE IS ONLY THE OPENING SHOT IN THE DEMOCRATIC AGENDA. THEY INTEND TO FOLLOW WITH A WHOLE SERIES OF WHAT ARE CALLED "MANDATED BENEFITS."

SENATOR KENNEDY IS ALREADY WRITING

LEGISLATION IMPOSING MANDATED HEALTH BENEFITS.

SENATOR DODD HAS ALREADY INTRODUCED LEGISLATION REQUIRING EMPLOYERS TO PROVIDE UP TO 10 WEEKS UNPAID LEAVE FOR THE BIRTH OR ADOPTION OF A CHILD AND AS MUCH OR MORE FOR THE SERIOUS ILLNESS OF EITHER THE EMPLOYEE OR HIS OR HER CHILD.

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THIS IS A TYPICAL DEMOCRATIC RESPONSE. TRADITIONALLY, WHILE THE REPUBLICANS PREFER CHOICES, THE DEMOCRATS OPT FOR MANDATES. IN DOING SO, THEY OF COURSE LIMIT THE OPTIONS GIVEN TO EMPLOYEES.

EVERY EMPLOYEES BENEFIT, EVEN UNPAID LEAVE, HAS A SIGNIFICANT COST. WHEN WE ARE DEALING WITH COSTS OF THIS MAGNITUDE, I BELIEVE THAT EMPLOYEES AND EMPLOYERS SHOULD HAVE SOME SAY.

FOR EXAMPLE, ONE EMPLOYEE MAY WANT HIS RESOURCES SPENT ON CHILD CARE, WHILE LONG-TERM CARE MAKES MORE SENSE FOR ANOTHER. IF A MANDATE IS IN PLACE, SOMEONE IS GOING TO LOSE. I BELIEVE THAT THE FREE MARKET SYSTEM DECIDES MORE EFFICIENTLY THAN CONGRESS HOW RESOURCES SHOULD BE ALLOCATED.

REPUBLICANS ALSO BELIEVE THAT THERE IS A ROLE FOR GOVERNMENT, ALONG WITH THE PRIVATE SECTOR, IN HELPING TO MAKE THESE BENEFITS AVAILABLE. IT IS NOT AN EITHER/OR PROPOSITION. THESE PROBLEMS ARE JUST TOO LARGE FOR THE GOVERNMENT OR THE PRIVATE SECTOR TO HANDLE ALONE.

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CONCLUSION

IN CLOSING, LET ME SAY THAT REPUBLICANS DO HAVE AN AGENDA, ECONOMIC GROWTH, SAFETY, AND FREE MARKET APPROACHES, WHERE POSSIBLE, TO THE VERY REAL PROBLEMS CONFRONTING EVERYDAY AMERICANS. WE INTEND TO SEE THAT AGENDA DEBATED AND ENACTED. WE BELIEVE THERE IS A REASON THAT REPUBLICANS HAVE BEEN ELECTED TO LEAD THIS

COUNTRY IN THE LAST THREE ELECTIONS, AND INTEND

TO TAKE UP THAT CHALLENGE.
