The California Ag Leadership Program allows promising young agricultural-related leaders between the ages of 27-40 to participate in a two year leadership program studying non-agricultural disciplines such as communications, social studies, government and economics. These leaders participate in a variety of seminars as well as national and international travel.

They are in Washington from the 10th through the 14th and are meeting with representatives of USTR, FDA, EPA, Interior, USDA, and the State department. They will also meet with Senate and House Ag Committee members and representatives of the Republican National Committee and Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee.

YOUR ROLE -- Participants include farmers and promising employees in agri-industry. There will be 30 - 40 in attendance. Senator Wilson's staff stresses that this is very informal and you can stay for less than 15 minutes if you wish. It is primarily an opportunity for them to meet with a member of the Senate leadership. Format has usually been Q's & A's. Most of them are Republicans. They are open to comments on any subject and are likely to be interested in your comments on the current Senate agenda.
