



REMARKS OF
JACKIE A. STRANGE
FOURTH ANNUAL TRIBUTE
THE DOLE FOUNDATION
MAY 3, 1989

I WELCOME YOU TO OUR FOURTH ANNUAL TRIBUTE. YOU CAN ALL TAKE PRIDE IN WHAT YOU HAVE HELPED TO MAKE POSSIBLE THIS YEAR.

THIS YEAR HAS BEEN SPECIAL IN MANY WAYS. WHILE WE HAVE HAD A VERY STRONG GRANTS PROGRAM SINCE THE FOUNDATION BECAME OPERATIONAL, THIS PAST YEAR HAS BEEN A TIME OF REDIRECTION. AS WE LOOKED AT THE SUPPORT BEING GIVEN BY ALL FOUNDATIONS TO THE EMPLOYMENT AREA, WE DECIDED THAT WE COULD BE EVEN MORE EFFECTIVE IS WE FOCUSED ON SPECIFIC NEEDS WITHIN THE DISABILITY COMMUNITY.

AS A RESULT, WE HAVE DEVELOPED TWO PROGRAMS: ONE IS THE COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP INITIATIVE WHERE WE ARE LINKING TOGETHER COMMUNITY FOUNDATIONS, SERVICE PROVIDERS AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR. WE HAVE IDENTIFIED FOUR MODEL SITES AND AS SOON AS THESE ARE OPERATING AT THE DESIRED LEVEL, WE WILL EXPAND THEM. IF EACH COMMUNITY SOLVES ITS OWN PROBLEMS, WE WILL THEN HAVE RESOLVED THE NATIONAL PROBLEM.

WE BEGAN THE SECOND MAJOR EFFORT ALMOST TWO YEARS AGO. AS WE EVALUATED THE NEEDS OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES, WE REALIZED THAT WHILE MANY EFFORTS WERE BEING MADE, THEY WERE VERY FRAGMENTED. THERE WAS NOT A SINGLE SOURCE THAT PEOPLE COULD GO FOR INFORMATION ON SERVICES, PRODUCTS OR JOBS. NOR WAS THERE A COORDINATED EFFORT TO SHARE ALL THAT HAD BEEN DONE OR IS BEING DONE FOR PEOPLE WITH DIASBILITIES.

WITH THE TECHNOLOGY EXPLOSION, FEW KNOW ABOUT THE AVAILABILITY OF MANY ASSISTIVE DEVICES OR OTHER ADAPTATIONS THAT COULD MAKE IT POSSIBLE FOR A PERSON TO WORK OR SIMPLY TO ADAPT TO THEIR SURROUNDINGS. THIS TECHNOLOGY NEEDS TO BE PUT IN THE HANDS OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES SO THAT THEY CAN BECOME MORE COMPETITIVE AND ENTER THE WORKFORCE. WE WANT TO ERASE ALL EXCUSES FOR EMPLOYERS NOT TO HIRE.

THIS VERY AMBITIOUS PLAN IS CALLED THE NATIONAL DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT NETWORK. IT IS DEVELOPED IN MODULES SO THAT WE CAN MOVE AHEAD AS WE OBTAIN FUNDING. WE EXPECT TO SHOWCASE ASSISTIVE DEVICES AND PRODUCE A SOFTWARE PROGRAM WHICH WILL PROVIDE PRODUCT INFORMATION ON A NATIONAL SCOPE. WE WILL PUBLISH EMPLOYER MANUALS TO ASSIST WITH HIRING AND PROMOTING PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES. ANOTHER MANUAL WILL DEPICT WORKSITE ADAPTATIONS NEEDED FOR EACH KIND OF DISABILITY. THE THIRD IS THE MOST COMPLEX BUT PERHAPS THE MOST CRITICAL: WE WILL SET UP FOUR DEMONSTRATION SITES TO PROVIDE JOB INFORMATION TO SPECIFIC GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS. WHEN WE HAVE WORKED ALL THE BUGS OUT, WE WILL EXPAND NATIONALLY. THESE SYSTEMS WILL BE COMPATIBLE NATIONWIDE SO THAT WE CAN PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN DATA.

WE HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN GETTING FIRM COMMITMENTS FROM NUMEROUS SOURCES: AT&T, IBM, THE J. M. FOUNDATION, THE STARR FOUNDATION, CIBA GEIGY, THE HEARST FOUNDATION, THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, ELECTRONICS INDUSTRIES, ADAPSO, AND THE SOCIAL SECURITY ADMINISTRATION. AND THERE ARE OTHERS AWAITING BOARD APPROVAL. ALREADY WE HAVE OVER A QUARTER OF A MILLION DOLLARS CONTRIBUTED IN FUNDS AND EXPECT AND NEED EVEN MORE. IT IS A MAMMOTH PROJECT UNLIKE ANYTHING EVER ATTEMPTED BEFORE. BUT ONE THAT WILL MAKE A TREMENDOUS DIFFERENCE IN THE LIVES OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES. I KNOW YOU JOIN ME IN THE EXCITEMENT OF THIS ENDEAVOR. THESE TWO PROJECTS AND OUR REGULAR GRANTS PROGRAM, WHICH IS ALIVE AND WELL, ARE THE KINDS OF PROGRAMS THAT YOU ARE MAKING POSSIBLE AND WE THANK YOU FOR THAT.

WE ARE GRATEFUL TO NORRELL FOR HELPING US SECURE THIS BEAUTIFUL FACILITY FOR THIS EVENT... AND TO THE MANY OTHERS WHO GAVE INKIND GIFTS. NORRELL HAS A SPECIAL INTEREST IN THE ARTS AND IN PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES AND HAVE PROMISED TO SUPPORT US IN SOME OTHERS WAYS LATER THIS YEAR.

GUY, WE THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT AND LOOK FORWARD TO CONTINUING OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH YOU.

- O GOOD EVENING, IT IS A PLEASURE TO BE HERE TONIGHT. I WANT TO SALUTE ALL OF YOU FOR SUPPORTING THE DOLE FOUNDATION AND ITS MISSION OF ENHANCING EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES.
- O AT THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, WE RECOGNIZE THE IMPORTANCE OF INCLUDING PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES IN AMERICA'S WORKFORCE. THERE ARE MORE THAN 37 MILLION DISABLED PEOPLE IN THIS COUNTRY, AND THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE FOR WORKING AGE PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES STANDS AT 67%
- OUR WORKFORCE IS CHANGING. WITH THE AGING OF THE BABY BOOM POPULATION, THERE WILL BE FEWER PEOPLE TO FILL TOMORROW'S JOBS. ALREADY, THE FAST FOOD AND BANKING INDUSTRIES, FOR EXAMPLE, HAVE EXPERIENCED SIGNIFICANT SHORTAGES IN AVAILABLE JOB ENTRANTS. NOW IS A PERFECT TIME FOR US TO INCLUDE THIS LARGELY UNTAPPED LABOR RESOURCE IN OUR WORKFORCE.
- O AND HIRING PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES IS SMART BUSINESS. STUDIES SHOW THAT DISABLED WORKERS PERFORM AS WELL OR BETTER THAN THEIR NON-DISABLED COUNTERPARTS IN OVERALL JOB PERFORMANCE.
- O WHEN PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES BECOME EMPLOYED, THEY BECOME TAX PAYERS RATHER THAN TAX CONSUMERS.
- O THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IS WORKING HARD TO HELP PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES FIND JOBS THROUGH PROJECTS WITH INDUSTRY, THE JOB TRAINING PARTNERSHIP ACT, VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION, AND TAX CREDITS FOR EMPLOYERS. OUR TASK IS TO MAKE SURE THAT THESE PROGRAMS RUN EFFICIENTLY AND HELP THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF PEOPLE.
- O INCREASINGLY, THE PRIVATE SECTOR IS TAKING ON A GREATER RESPONSIBILITY IN INCORPORATING DISABLED PEOPLE INTO THE WORKFORCE. MARRIOTT CORPORATION IS AN EXCELLENT EXAMPLE OF A BUSINESS THAT ACTIVELY SEEKS OUT DISABLED APPLICANTS AND BENEFITS BY THE QUALITY OF WORK THEY PRODUCE.
