TEXT FOR U.S. CAPITOL PRESERVATION COMMITTEE EVENT

On November 21st, 1800, the Senate met for the first time in the unfinished Capitol Building. It had taken four days to assemble a quorum, and conditions in the new capital city-- 33 hours by coach from the temporary capital in Philadelphia-- were less than ideal.

Yet when President Adams appeared the next day before the assembled Congress, he offered congratulations on " the prospect of a residence not to be changed."
