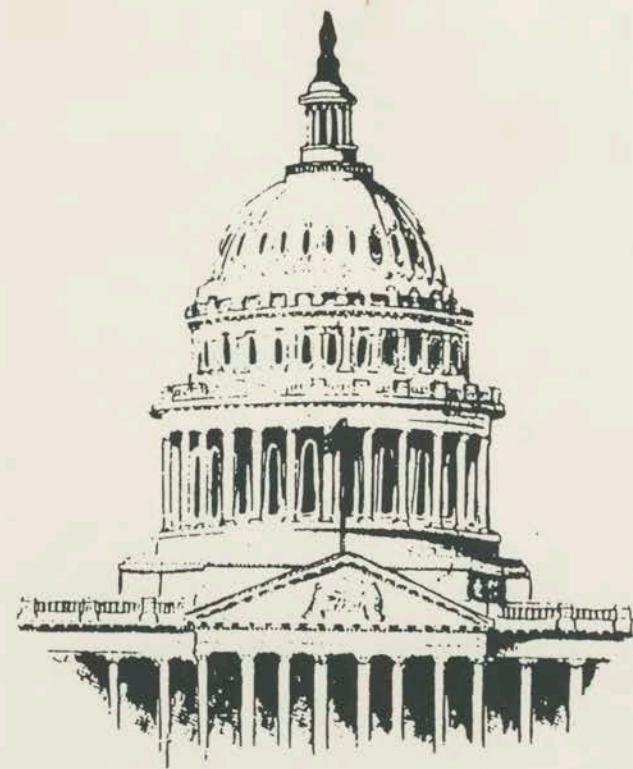

REMARKS AT SENATE PAGE AWARDS

JUNE 15, 1990

IT'S A PLEASURE TO JOIN YOU
THIS MORNING FOR THIS VERY
SPECIAL CEREMONY. IT'S ALSO
ESPECIALLY GRATIFYING TO SEE
SO MANY PARENTS AND
TEACHERS HERE, WHO ARE SO
IMPORTANT TO THE SUCCESS OF
THE PAGE PROGRAM.

YOU DON'T NEED ME TO TELL
YOU HOW IMPORTANT PAGES
ARE TO THE SENATE. BUT YOU
MAY NOT KNOW THAT PAGES
HAVE BEEN A PART OF THIS
BODY FOR MORE THAN 160
YEARS. THE SENATE HAD HAD
OLDER MESSENGERS SINCE 1789,
BUT IT WAS NOT UNTIL 1829
THAT SENATOR DANIEL WEBSTER
OF MASSACHUSSETTS BEGAN
THE TRADITION OF EMPLOYING

YOUNG PAGES. NEVERTHELESS,
IT WAS STILL A LITTLE DIFFERENT
BACK THEN —— 12—YEAR OLD
ISAAC BASSETT, THE SECOND
PAGE EVER APPOINTED, DIDN'T
HAVE A DAY LIKE THIS ONE.
HE SERVED THE SENATE FOR THE
NEXT 64 YEARS AS A PAGE
AND ASSISTANT DOORKEEPER.
AND BACK THEN, A PAGE'S
TASKS WERE A LITTLE DIFFERENT.
PAGES WERE EXPECTED TO KEEP

THE INKWELLS AND
SANDSHAKERS FILLED, TO LIGHT
THE GAS LAMPS, TO KEEP THE
CHAMBERS WOOD STOVES
BURNING, AND TO DELIVER
MESSAGES DOWNTOWN —— ON
HORSEBACK.

NO DOUBT ABOUT IT, BEING A
PAGE GIVES YOU A RINGSIDE
SEAT ON AMERICAN HISTORY.
AND THAT SEAT AFFORDS A
TREMENDOUSLY VALUABLE

LEARNING EXPERIENCE, THE KIND
OF GROWTH AND EDUCATION
THAT A CLASSROOM CAN'T
PROVIDE. YOU'VE SEEN THE
SPEECHES, THE DEBATES, THE
COMPROMISES, AND THE UPS
AND DOWNS OF POLITICS —
ALL FROM A UNIQUE VANTAGE
POINT THAT MANY OF YOUR
FRIENDS COULD ONLY IMAGINE.
