NO GREATER LOVE SPONSORS A CELEBRATION OF FREEDOM FOR ROBERT POLHILL AND FRANK REED, FORMER HOSTAGES IN LEBANON

DATE: Thursday, July 26, 1990

SPONSOR: No Greater Love

WASHINGTON, D.C.--A reception celebrating the freedom of Robert Polhill and Frank Reed will be held in Room 192 of the Dirksen Senate Office Building on July 26, 1990 from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m.

Robert Polhill was held hostage in Lebanon for 39 months and was released on April 22; Frank Reed was held hostage for 44 months and was released on May 2. Honorary hosts for the reception are Senator Robert Dole, Senator Edward M. Kennedy and Senator Daniel P. Moynihan, all members of the No Greater Love National Advisory Council.

Carmella LaSpada, CEO of No Greater Love, said, "The purpose of this reception is to offer Members of Congress and government officials an opportunity to personally welcome home these two former hostages."

Among the guests are three AFL-CIO union officials whose unions are supporters of No Greater Love's hostage projects: Jake West, President, International Association of Iron Workers, Edward Carlough, President, International Association of Sheet Metal Workers and William DuVal, President, International Brotherhood of

Painters and Allied Trades. Invited guests include members of Congress, Ambassadors of Algeria and Lebanon and government officials, former hostages in Lebanon and in Iran, and the families of hostages Thomas Sutherland, who has been held captive in Lebanon since June 8, 1985, and Joseph Cicippio, who has been held captive in Lebanon since September 12, 1987.

No Greater Love is America's only organization devoted to providing programs of friendship and care for the families of Americans who died in war or by acts of terrorism. It also serves as a support group for the families of the hostages. This national, non-profit, non-political humanitarian organization was founded in 1971.
