THE GROWING NUMBER OF SENIORS IN OUR SOCIETY AS WELL AS THE EVER RISING COSTS OF HEALTH AND LONG-TERM CARE ASSURE THAT HEALTH CARE WILL CONTINUE TO BE AN ISSUE OF SIGNIFICANT IMPORTANCE.
