

THE FLORIDA COUNCIL OF 100...

The Florida Council of 100, formed in 1961, enjoys the distinction of being one of the few organizations of its kind in the United States. It was formed to promote the economic development of Florida. Since its inception, the Council has broadened its purpose to encompass a multitude of areas affecting the overall quality of life for Floridians.

The Council works in close harmony with the Governor, branches of State government and civic groups to accomplish its goals. It is a nonpartisan organization, deriving its revenue entirely from the dues of its members. It is nonprofit, nonpolitical, costs the taxpayer nothing and is not a State agency. It operates on a system of working committees under a chairman, vice chairman and board of directors. The committees are involved in such diverse areas as agriculture, education, government relations, human affairs, and economic development.

Membership in the Council of 100 is limited to chief executive officers or the equivalent of major firms, and is divided into five categories: Resident, Nonresident, Sustaining, Honorary and Ex Officio. Resident members live and work in Florida and have achieved a high degree of success and recognition in their field. They are appointed for a three year term and are limited to 105 in number. Nonresident members live outside Florida but have commercial interests in the State. Sustaining membership is granted to long-time members who have made significant contributions in Council activities. Honorary membership is a category reserved primarily for Florida's former governors. Ex Officio membership is offered to a select number of key State officials and university presidents.

Along with countless opportunities, Florida faces numerous challenges. The Florida Council of 100 utilizes in an integrated system the best talent available in the fields of industry, business, government and education to judiciously achieve "a higher standard of living for every Floridian."
