

Dear Senator Dole:

My name is Dr. Joseph E. Oesterling. I obtained my urologic training under Dr. Patrick C. Walsh at the Johns Hopkins Hospital and am currently on the faculty at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota.

At this year's annual meeting of the American Urological Association in Washington, D.C., I will be serving as the chairman of a three-hour symposium entitled "Prostate-Specific Antigen: New Concepts for the Diagnosis and Management of Prostate Cancer." The objectives of this symposium are to:

- 1) Provide practicing urologists with the latest developments in the field of PSA.
- 2) Inform the general practitioner and internist about the value of early detection of prostate cancer and how PSA may have a pivotal role in this process.

This symposium will be held on Saturday, May 9, 1992, beginning at 6 p.m. at the Grand Hyatt Hotel in Washington, D.C. The expectant attendance is approximately 1,000 physicians, who are involved in the care of patients at risk for developing prostate cancer.

Senator Dole, I would like to formally invite you to attend the symposium and be our distinguished guest speaker. All of us at the American Urological Association would be honored if you could give a short, 10-minute presentation on your viewpoint of prostate cancer and PSA.
