The farm entrance will be decorated with a banner, scripted in Russian, welcoming Pres. Yeltsin and his delegation to Kansas. A new John Deere combine will harvest wheat next to the house. A static display of farm machinery, including Kansas companies such as Hesston and others, will include signs in both Russian and English describing the machines.

Plans are to eat lunch outside, but should inclement weather occur a machine shed will house the meal area, with an awning on one side to accommodate more people. The meal will consist of pork and beef burgers, wheat buns, potato salad, baked beans, cole slaw, potato chips, condiments for the burgers, chocolate cake, ice cream, lemonade, ice tea, and coffee. The caterers, who will provide much of the menu and labor, are a local, family run business who can accommodate 300 people in fourteen minutes. Tables, chairs, and hay bales will be on hand for most of the people and will be decorated in checkered cloth.

A hay rack decorated with hay bales will serve as a stage and will be equipped with an adequate sound system (ie. two microphones).

The State Bd. of Ag. is also working on a big gift basket of Kansas Ag. products for Yeltsin and smaller gift baskets for the rest of the delegation. A gift for Mrs. Yeltsin will also be presented if she is in attendance.

Dear Mike:

For several months the Sedgwick County Zoo has communicated with zoo officials in the Soviet Union on establishing an animal exchange.

On Monday, June 1, 1992, the Sedgwick County Zoo received a fax letter from a representative of the Moscow Zoo indicating a desire to obtain a "Timber Rattlesnake".

Sedgwick Zoo Director, Mark Reed, returned a positive response. The Sedgwick County Zoo's large reptile collection does in fact include a Timber Rattlesnake, and we would warmly welcome the opportunity to provide the Moscow Zoo with a member of our zoo reptile family.

Our proposal is to make this presentation during the visit of Soviet Leader, Boris Yeltsin. The Board of County Commissioners and Sedgwick County Zoo Officials would be honored to have Mr. Yeltsin make a brief visit to our zoo with the opportunity to see the Timber Rattlesnake that would soon find a home in Moscow.

We believe such an exchange could be the beginning of long-lasting communications between Sedgwick County and the Soviet Union, that could lead to open dialogue on the vast agricultural opportunities our county has to offer.

Andover

I spoke with Pat Stuenkel about the status of the FEMA assistance. Although Andover was approved for \$289,000, so far they have only gotten \$129,000. The problem is not FEMA, but the State Emergency Preparedness Agency. Pat wants to wait to give the State a final big push until after Andover submits their final project request -- a \$102,000 road paving project -- sometime toward the end of June.

Pat was very positive about how the town is rebuilding. She says all but 4 or 5 of the tornado damaged houses are occupied and 34 building permits for new houses have been issued. The dark spot is the trailer park -- it is down to 90 trailers from 217 before the storm. She believes that many of the people living in trailers have purchased houses.

Attached is the status of our petition drive as of mail delivered to Scott Morgan today.

We have contacted Secretary of State's office and have been advised that experience shows if a candidate files 25% in excess of the number required to get on the ballot, they will qualify. We are beyond that 25%+ threshold.

Contrary to what I had been advised previously, we cannot file petitions as well as pay the filing fee.

Therefore, plan is to have Scott take the petitions tomorrow to Secretary of State's office; they will perform an unofficial review to see if they note any glaring problems. If none are apparent (and we expect none), Scott will file the petitions tomorrow, following which they will be sent to the County Clerks for review.

By Tuesday (or absolute latest, Wednesday), we will know if we are facing a problem with our petitions. None are expected, but if there were to be any, we would simply pay the filing fee on Wednesday and the petitions would be ignored. (I am expressing the check to Scott in case we need it.)

In the unlikely event we do have to pay the filing fee instead of filing by petition, it will be necessary for you to sign a statement of candidacy which must be witnessed by an election official or someone from Bill Graves' office. Scott Morgan is working with Mike Glassner to arrange sometime in this weekend's schedule to hook up someone with you to obtain your signature on these forms when they can be so-witnessed.
