# Quentin Burdick

"I've tried to respond to the needs of the ordinary person. Mostly poor people. And I think my record will bear that out."

# **Burdick on Burdick\***

On entering politics

"I had a plan when I started in politics: Here's a block of farmers. Then I did a lot of work in the courtroom for the labor guys. Then I worked for the senior citizens. We cracked quite a nut in North Dakota (getting elected as a Democrat). Remember, this is a Republican state. The key to my success was the people. They count. John Doe has just as big a vote as Smith, chairman of the board."

On his frugality

"How can you begin the practice of law and get into business in the very depth of the Depression and not be frugal? You can't. There is where you are branded — right there."

On his rumpled looks

"If you think my ties are dirty, you should have seen his!" (Burdick comparing himself to his father)

# On free time

"Free time — what's that? I like to tinker with building things — hammer and saw. I like cleaning the furnace. I like to play around with my hands."

On senators making long speeches

"They do a lot speaking. Lot of talking. More than I would. I want to gather up the votes. I don't care about the speeches. I'm a workhorse, not a showhorse."

On aging

"I think the best way to approach aging is not to think about it. Be interested in whatever you are doing and stay there."

Quentin Northrop Burdick was born in Munich, North Dakota, in 1908 and moved to Williston at age 2. He grew up breaking wild ponies on the family ranch. He captained Williston High School's undefeated football team and then played for the University of Minnesota, where he blocked for future Hall-of-Famer Bronko Nagurski. Between games he earned a law degree.

Upon graduating in 1932, he joined his father, Usher, a future U.S. congressman, in the practice of law. During the Depression, Burdick worked with the Farmers Union to defend and advise farmers threatened with foreclosure.

He joined the new Non-Partisan League, a populist-progressive group allied with the Republicans, and lost several races for local and statewide offices. Believing NPLers had no future in the Republican column, Burdick joined the Democrats. The NPL followed him into the Democratic Party in 1956.

Burdick lost six elections before he was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1958, becoming the first Democrat North Dakota sent to Washington. On June 28, 1960, he won a special election to fill the unexpired term of the late Sen. William Langer. He was re-elected in 1964, 1970, 1976, 1982, and 1988.

In 1987, Burdick became chairman of the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee. He also chaired the Appropriations Sub-committee on Agriculture. He formed and co-chaired the Senate Rural Health Caucus and served on the Special Committee on Aging and the Select Committee on Indian Affairs.

In 1933, Burdick married Marietta Janecky, who died in 1958. They had four children, Jonathan, Jan Mary, Jennifer, and Jessica. In 1960, Burdick married Jocelyn Birch Peterson, a widow with two children, Leslie and Birch. Their son, Gage, is deceased.
