

Steve Symms was born in Nampa, Idaho on April 23, 1938, and graduated from Caldwell High School. He earned his Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Idaho in 1960. After graduation, he served three years in the U.S. Marine Corps. Following his discharge from the Corps with the rank of Lieutenant, he returned to manage the family fruit ranch.

In 1972, this political unknown ran for and was elected to the U.S. Congress on the platform of more freedom and less government. He won reelection to the U.S. House three times before he battled a 24 year Senate veteran in 1980 for the chance to take his message to the U.S. Senate. He won that race and successfully defended it against a 10 year sitting Governor in 1986.

Since then, Steve has compiled an impressive list of legislative accomplishment to accompany his fights for principle, but none more impressive than his work as the Ranking Republican on the Senate Subcommittee on Water Resources, Transportation and Infrastructure. This nation's transportation networks will long benefit from his capable efforts.

During his tenure in Congress, Steve has become a national spokesman for conservative causes, an outspoken leader fighting for fiscal restraint, lower taxes, and the free market system and a staunch defender of Americans' right to keep and bear arms.

He has served as Chairman of the Conservative of the Conservative Victory Fund and the Free Society Forum and is the founder of Idaho's "Working Partners" organization, whose volunteers work to solve social problems through private means. He has received repeated recognition from organizations such as the National Federation of Independent Business, the Freedoms Foundation, the American Security Council, the Watchdog of the Treasury, Americans for Constitutional Action and the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

He has also earned the friendship and respect of those with whom he served.

I WAS ASKED TO TALK
