It has come to my attention that the United States Senate does not have access to the Internet, a loosely organized system of interconnected computer networks with over 10 million users worldwide.

I believe that it would be to the benefit of you and your staff to have the capability to access this important resource. The Senate computer center has indicated to me that the possibility of connection to the Internet is being explored, and I would like to urge you to look into the resource and add your voices to a request that the United States Senate have the capability of logging on to the Internet.

The backbone of the Internet is the NSFNET (National Science Foundation Network). The NSF was given responsibility within the federal government for coordinating the Internet in 1985. Funding for Internet operations comes from the five federal agencies involved in operating research networks and from universities, states, and private companies involved in operating and participating in local and regional networks as well as the NSFNET backbone. While federal funding plays a key role, a substantially greater share of financial support for Internet operations comes from non-federal sources of funding.

Users of the Internet currently may use it and other networks for a variety of functions including:

- Electronic mail (e-mail) and electronic publishing
- Software and data file transfer
- Graphics and image file transfer
- Remote computer access
- Remote access to computerized databases.

The most popular network function to date is electronic mail. E-mail is partially replacing written and telephone communication within many research communities. In the future, e-mail users are expected to be able to convey information with integrated text, sound, graphics, and video.

A continued evolution of the Internet is envisioned by proponents, and in fact transforming the system to a full-fledged National Research and Education Network (NREN) is a project currently underway. Some funding for the NREN is included in S. 4, the National Competitiveness Act.

I believe that the Senate is losing a technological edge by not having access to the Internet. All the resources that more than 10 million users worldwide have access to are available to you and your staff only on paper, and with a time delay. The conferences that routinely take place on Internet Bulletin Boards are not currently available to Senate staff.

The White House is already hooked to the Internet and is accepting e-mail. White House transcripts can be accessed by the public. The House of Representatives also has access to the Internet.

There is increasing evidence that the Internet contributes to increases in national productivity, since it allows educators, researchers, scientists and the like to communicate with their counterparts worldwide. I would like to take this opportunity to urge you to join with me in an effort to bring the United States Senate into the Internet user community. I believe it will provide you and your staffs with a wide array of resources that will contribute to productivity and will allow us all to access the most up to date and accurate information possible.
