PREVENT ENTERING OR MOVING
ABOUT. BUT RAMPS AND LIFTS
CAN MAKE IT ACCESSIBLE -WITH ALL IT MAY OFFER -WHETHER A JOB, AN
EDUCATION, OR REGISTERING
TO VOTE.

ACCOMMODATIONS HAVE

ALSO BEEN UNAVAILABLE. FOR

A PERSON WITH LIMITED VISION,

A LARGE PRINT MENU CAN **ALLOW EASY AND UNASSISTED** SELECTION OF A MEAL. INDEED, ACCESSIBILITY AND **ACCOMMODATIONS ARE NOT** CONVENIENCES FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES, BUT ARE **ESSENTIAL IF THEY ARE TO BE** PRODUCTIVE AND ACTIVE CITIZENS.

DISABILITY AFFECTS ALL, RE-PUBLICAN OR DEMOCRAT, RICH OR POOR, OF WHATEVER SEX OR ETHNIC BACKGROUND. IT DOES NOT DISCRIMINATE, AND NEITHER SHOULD WE. BUT **UNLESS WE PROVIDE ACCESSIBILITY AND** ACCOMMODATIONS, WE **EXCLUDE PEOPLE WITH** 

DISABILITIES, AND, INTENTIONALLY OR NOT, DIS-CRIMINATE AGAINST THEM. IN TURN, I PROMISE YOU THAT WE IN CONGRESS WILL DO OUR PART. WE ARE COMMITTED TO SEEING THAT ADA WORKS FOR **EVERYONE -- INCLUDING** BUSINESS.

-- SECOND, REMOVING **ATTITUDINAL BARRIERS** I WISH ADA WAS THE TOTAL SOLUTION TO EQUAL OPPORTU-NITY FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABIL-ITIES, BUT IT'S NOT. SOME OF **BIGGEST BARRIERS ARE ONES** WE CANNOT SEE, AND ONES NO LAW CAN REMOVE --ATTITUDINAL BARRIERS. TOO

OFTEN WE OVERLOOK THE TALENTS AND ABILITIES OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES, WHO ARE ALSO EMPLOYEES AND CUSTOMERS. CONCLUSION IN CLOSING, WE CAN SAY WITH PRIDE THAT AMERICA TODAY IS A BETTER PLACE FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES THAN AT ANY

OTHER TIME.

INDEED, FIFTY YEARS AGO, WE HAD A PRESIDENT, FRANKLIN ROOSEVELT, WHO COULD NOT WALK AND BELIEVED IT **NECESSARY TO DISGUISE THAT** FACT FROM THE PUBLIC IN ORDER TO BE ELECTED. **BUT TODAY I TRUST THAT AMERICANS WOULD HAVE NO** 

PROBLEM IN ELECTING A MAN
OR WOMAN PRESIDENT SIMPLY
BECAUSE OF A DISABILITY.
