TOGETHER FOR A BARN-RAISING, VOLUNTEERISM HAS **BEEN PART OF A GREAT** NATIONAL TRADITION--AND WE **CERTAINLY SAW THAT** TRADITION CONTINUED DURING THE RECENT MIDWESTERN FLOODS. AND NOW UNCLE SAM WILL BE STEPPING IN, GIVING THE FEDERAL SEAL OF **APPROVAL TO CERTAIN**

CHARITIES AND ACTIVITIES, AND PAYING VOLUNTEERS.

*THE FACT IS THAT ANY MONEY THE VICE PRESIDENT SAVES BY CUTTING DOWN REGULATIONS ON THE SIZE OF **GOVERNMENT ASHTRAYS IS A** MERE PITTANCE COMPARED TO THE MONEY THIS **ADMINISTRATION IS SPENDING** ON MORE GOVERNMENT.

*WE ALSO GOT SOME NEWS
THIS WEEK FROM THE NONPARTISAN CONGRESSIONAL
BUDGET OFFICE, WHICH
RELEASED ITS MID-SESSION
BUDGET REVIEW.

*THERE WERE A LOT OF
CHARGES FLYING AROUND
DURING LAST MONTH'S BUDGET
DEBATE, AND THE CBO--WHICH
PRESIDENT CLINTON HAS

PRAISED AS THE OFFICIAL
SCOREKEEPER--CONCLUDED
THAT THE REPUBLICANS WERE
RIGHT.

*THE REVIEW SHOWED THAT
THE CLINTON BUDGET PLAN
WILL NOT REDUCE THE DEFICIT
BY \$505 BILLION AS CLAIMED BY
THE WHITE HOUSE, OR EVEN
\$496 BILLION, AS CLAIMED BY
CONGRESSIONAL DEMOCRATS.

ACCORDING TO CBO, TOTAL
DEFICIT REDUCTION WILL BE
CLOSER TO \$432 BILLION OVER
5 YEARS.

THOSE NUMBERS ARE VERY
CLOSE TO THE ONES
REPUBLICANS WERE CRITICIZED
FOR DURING THE BUDGET
DEBATE. AND IT'S IMPORTANT
TO REMEMBER THAT AFTER THE
INITIAL DEFICIT REDUCTION

CAUSED BY THE PRESIDENT'S
MASSIVE TAX INCREASE, THE
DEFICIT WILL SKYROCKET BACK
UP.

*BUT THE CBO DID AGREE
WITH THE WHITE HOUSE ON ONE
POINT--THE FACT THAT OVER
THE NEXT FIVE YEARS,
ECONOMIC GROWTH WILL
NEVER GROW AT A RATE
EXCEEDING 2.7%. REMEMBER

THAT DURING THE CAMPAIGN, PRESIDENT BUSH WAS DRAGGED THROUGH THE MUD BECAUSE ECONOMIC GROWTH IN 1992 WAS "ONLY" 3.9% *WHY THE ECONOMIC SLOWDOWN? MY BELIEF IS THAT THE PRESIDENT'S TAX AND SPEND BUDGET PLAN AND THE THREAT OF MORE TAXES TO PAY FOR HEALTH CARE REFORM HAS

BUSINESS--ESPECIALLY SMALL BUSINESS--WORRIED.

*SMALL BUSINESSMEN AND **WOMEN ARE TELLING ME THAT** THEY ARE REACTING TO TAX **INCREASES THE ONLY WAY THEY** COULD. BY CUTTING COSTS. BY NOT BUYING THAT PIECE OF EQUIPMENT. BY NOT HIRING THAT NEW WORKER, OR OPENING THAT NEW OFFICE.

*AND NOW THEY'RE READING REPORTS THAT THE PRESIDENT'S HEALTH CARE PLAN WILL INVOLVE A BIG **INCREASE IN THEIR PAYROLL** TAX. AND THAT WILL MEAN FURTHER CUTBACKS, FEWER **PURCHASES, AND FEWER NEW** JOBS.

*DESPITE THE BAD ECONOMIC NEWS, I THINK YOU'D HAVE TO SAY THAT PRESIDENT CLINTON HAD A GOOD WEEK. IT'S HARD TO ARGUE AGAINST CUTTING **GOVERNMENT WASTE. AND** EVEN THOUGH HIS FOREIGN POLICY TEAM PLAYED NO PART IN THE ISRAEL-P.L.O. **NEGOTIATIONS, THEY'RE** RECEIVING SOME OF THE GOOD FEELINGS WHICH COME WITH HOPES FOR PEACE IN THIS

TROUBLED REGION.

*AND THAT'S THE WAY IT'S
GOING TO BE. THE PRESIDENT
IS GOING TO HAVE HIS GOOD
WEEKS AND HIS BAD WEEKS.
HIS NUMBERS WILL PROBABLY
GO UP AND DOWN IN THE
POLLS.

*BUT THROUGH IT ALL, OUR ROLE AS REPUBLICANS
REMAINS THE SAME.

*AND THAT'S NOT TO THROW ROCKS AT THE PRESIDENT. NOT TO OBSTRUCT FOR **OBSTRUCTION'S SAKE. BUT TO** CONTINUE TO ADVOCATE THE PRINCIPLES THAT UNITED REPUBLICANS IN CONGRESS AND ACROSS THE NATION **DURING THIS SUMMER'S** BUDGET DEBATE.
