*EVEN PEOPLE WHO MAY

PRESIDENT'S HEALTH CARE
PLAN ARE SKEPTICAL OF

TURNING ONE-SEVENTH OF THE TOTAL ECONOMY TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.

*THE POINT IS THAT THE
PRESIDENT'S PROGRAM IS
LOSING SUPPORT, AND WILL
CONTINUE TO LOSE SUPPORT
BECAUSE THE AMERICAN
PEOPLE CANNOT RECALL THE
LAST THING THE GOVERNMENT

OPERATED THAT THEY THOUGHT
WAS SATISFACTORY OR THEY
WANTED MORE OF.

*DON'T GET ME WRONG.

REPUBLICANS--JUST LIKE
