MGM GRAND AND SUNRISE HOSPITAL DEVELOP INNOVATIVE APPROACH TO HEALTH CARE



And while media from around the world recorded the event, Woolf received a plaque from Guinness World Book of Records General Manager Oli Manlet, confirming the resort's status as the largest hotel and also the largest casino in the world.

A tremendous eight-minute fireworks display followed the initial festivities, which were described by pyrotechnics experts as the most intense barrage ever attempted. After the sky show, guests were treated to a reception and dinner, featuring all of the eateries represented in the hotel's "restaurant row."

Commenting on what visitors and guests can expect in the future at the MGM Grand, Senior Vice President - Marketing & Entertainment Richard Sturm said, "Our goal is to dominate every category of entertainment in this city. MGM Grand, Inc. majority shareholder Kirk Kerkorian opened his first Las Vegas property, the International Hotel, in 1969. At the time, it was heralded as the largest hotel in the world with 1,517 rooms. Sold to Hilton Hotels Corp. in 1971, the hotel still operates as the Las Vegas Hilton.

again noted as the largest hotel in the world.

In 1978, MGM Grand opened its second property and first hotel outside of Las Vegas, the MGM Grand Reno. Both the Las Vegas and Reno properties were later sold to Bally Manufacturing Corp. in 1986.

In 1988, the company purchased the Desert Inn and Sands hotels from Summa Corp. The 821-room Desert Inn came with its famous golf course, the site of many professional tournaments. A year later, the Sands was sold to the Interface Group of Boston.

In 1989, MGM Grand bought the Marina Hotel-Casino at the south end of the Las Vegas "Strip" and soon after, in 1990, acquired the 100-acre Tropicana Country Club adjacent to the Marina.

In 1991, MGM Grand, Inc., whose largest stockholder is Kirk Kerkorian, sold the Desert Inn to Tracinda Corp., the private holding company of Kerkorian.

On Oct. 7, 1991, MGM Grand, Inc. began construction on the former Marina and Tropicana Country Club sites, a total of 112 acres. The \$1 billion construction project is the largest in the history of Nevada.

In early 1994, the MGM Grand Hotel, Casino & Theme Park will debut as the premier destination and attraction in Las Vegas. The property consists of the world's largest hotel, with 5,005 guest rooms including 751 suites, the world's largest casino at 171,500

Manpower Training Cooperative (MTC) Update

Barrick Goldstrike's involvement in the Manpower Training Cooperative (MTC) began in September 1989 when Barrick sent six full-time employees through a Skills Improvement Program at Northern Nevada Community College. From this initial program, the Mechanical Technology Training Program sponsored by MTC member companies was born.

The Mechanical Technology Training Program is a special career opportunity for high school graduates interested in the fields of Diesel Technology, Maintenance Electrician Technology or Mill Mechanics. The Manpower Training Cooperative is a group of companies that sponsors the Mechanical Technology Training Program and currently includes Barrick Goldstrike Mines, Newmont Gold Company, Round Mountain Gold and Cashman Equipment Company. Past sponsors have included Dee Gold Mining Company, Marigold, Pinson, Pioneer Equipment Company and Miner's Pick (Nevada Mining Association vendors).

Each MTC member sponsors one or more students in the training program. A \$3,000 student scholarship is paid to successful applicants during the 40-week program, disbursed \$1,000 per semester. The scholarship pays for tuition, fees and some books. In addition, MTC sponsored students are given paid on-the-job work experience during the summer and the semester break at Christmas.

August 30, 1993 saw the start of the fourth group of MTC scholarship students at Northern Nevada Community College. There are 35 students participating in this 1993 - 1994 group and Barrick Goldstrike is proudly sponsoring 16 of these students. These students have come from all over the northeastern Nevada service area to be a part of this joint business-college initiative.

The first two groups (Fall 1990 and 1991) were on a two year schedule that alternated between worksite experience and course work at the college. With the start of the third group (Fall 1992), the program switched to a 40-week schedule of training during which all of the required courses in the three specialized areas of Diesel, Electrical and Mill Maintenance are completed. The fourth group (Fall 1993) continues on the 40-week schedule. Once students complete the 40 weeks, they are then eligible for job placement.

Northern Nevada Community College is in the process of refining the 40-week program to include the General Education core requirements into the program. This will enable the students to receive their Associate of Applied Science degree on completion of the program.

MTC, INC. UPDATE SPRING 1994

August 30, 1993 saw the start of the fourth group of MTC scholarship students at NNCC. There were 33 students in this year's group. Students come to us from all of the NNCC service area in northeastern Nevada. You will remember that the first two groups were on a 2-year schedule that alternated between worksite experience and coursework at NNCC.

With the start of the third group, the program switched to a 40-week schedule of training during which all of the required courses in the three specialized areas of diesel, electrical and mill maintenance are completed.

When students finish the 40 weeks, they are then eligible for job placement. The fourth group (1993/94) continues on the 40-week schedule. NNCC is in the process of refining the 40-week program and we hope to get the General Education requirements into the program. This will enable the students to get the Associate of Applied Science degree in the 40 weeks.

Northern Nevada Community College has been involved in meeting the training needs of the mining industry in northeastern Nevada for the past decade. This exemplary training partnership has grown tremendously during the past six years.

The inability of Newmont Gold Company to find and keep trained diesel and mill mechanics at the level needed forced them into training their unskilled laborers to keep up with work force demands. Planning between Newmont and NNCC administration and their staffs led to the development of complete programs in diesel mechanics, mill mechanics, and electrical maintenance. Newmont supplied the initial money for the onset of courses; this money was used to hire instructors and purchase equipment. The programs were successful and University and Community College System of Nevada (UCCSN) gave its approval to add them to the system programs. Barrick Goldstrike Mines, Inc. also joined in this training strategy. The programs continue to thrive.

To date, Newmont has sent 130 employees through the programs.

The success of the training then led to the formation of the Manpower Training Cooperative, Inc. (MTC, Inc.), which is a non-profit training corporation consisting of the area mines and vendors, that provides scholarships to the young people of northeastern Nevada.

To date, 118 students received scholarships during the first 4 years of the MTC, Inc. program. The fifth group of 37 is now being recruited; these students will start the program after high school graduation the Spring of 1994.

The success of the programs has led NNCC to form a partnership with Caterpillar Corporation/Cashman Equipment Company. NNCC became one of only 24 institutions in the nation to be affiliated with this type of partnership.



What is MTTP?

The Mechanical Technology Training Program (MTTP) is a special career opportunity for high school graduates interested in mechanical technology.

MTTP is an intensive one-year, three-semester program which combines classroom and laboratory instruction at Northern Nevada Community College. Paid on-the-job work experience is possible with Nevada mining companies, their suppliers, and equipment vendors during the summer and semester break.

Careers in mechanical technology include diesel technicians, mill mechanics, welding technicians, and industrial maintenance electricians. Completion of MTTP will qualify graduates for employment in a field with a future, a job with good pay and excellent benefits, and job skills useful for the rest of their lives.

Manpower Training Cooperative, Inc. (MTC), is a group of companies that sponsors MTTP and currently includes Newmont Gold, Barrick-Goldstrike, and Round Mountain Gold. Northern Nevada Community College in Elko is a member of the University and Community College System of Nevada and a fully-accredited institution.

Why Consider MTTP?

A \$3,000 scholarship is paid to successful applicants during the NNCC 45-week program. This scholarship pays for tuition, fees and some books.

During the work periods, participants are paid the

regular wage of an entry level laborer.

Upon successful completion of the program, students will be prepared for employment in their field of training and have received an Associate of Applied Science in their major field of study.

In short, MTTP provides up-to-date training at NNCC, that prepares students for employment in the mining industry and by other industry-related employers.

Mechanical Technology Training Program At Northern Nevada Community College

Who Fits Into MTTP?

A solid high school record is essential for successful applicants, including good attendance and creditable grades. Evidence of mechanical aptitude, good character, strong work ethic, and a genuine interest in mechanical technology as a career are strong considerations in selecting students for MTTP. Because this is a college program, successful applicants need to have good mathematical, reading, and writing skills.

How Do I Apply?

Eligible high school seniors and others interested in the program may obtain an application form from their High School Guidance Counselor or by contacting:

The completed application form must be accompanied by a copy of the student's most recent high school transcript, attendance record, and health records. These forms must be received at NNCC no later than March 31,

Applicants should be prepared to attend an interview and to complete aptitude testing to be conducted at NNCC. A complete physical examination will be required of all successful applicants, including a screen for drugs and alcohol. Federal law requires that workers employed at a mine-site must be 18 years old. Applicants must provide proof that they will be 18 years old no later than June 1 of the year of their graduation. Final acceptance into the program is contingent upon graduation with their regular class.

How Does the Program Work?

During early June, successful applicants may meet at Northern Nevada Community College for safety training and orientation. During the summer, some participants may be employed as laborers at two or three of the participating sponsors. Participants will be expected to conform to the work rules of the various job-sites and will be paid at the existing basic laborer

From September of 1994 through June of 1995, trainees will study at Northern Nevada Community College in Elko, taking cousework that applies to the AAS degree as well as specialized coursework in their major area.
