- Stenholm voted to require taxpayers to foot the bill for politicians' campaigns for Congress, at a cost of \$1 billion over the next 8 years (Roll Call No. 79, April 9, 1992);
- Stenholm opposed a measure that would have required the President to Certify that the national interest is at stake before committing U.S. troops under the command of a foreign national on behalf of the United Nations (Roll Call #473, September 2, 1993).





### Boren's Aide Isn't Getting a Free Ride In Oklahoma Special

With little national fanfare, an extremely close race is shaping up in the May 10 special election to fill the Oklahoma 6th district seat vacated by Democrat Glenn English, who left the Hill in January to become executive vice president of the National Rural Electric Cooperatives Association.

The race pits 34-year-old state Rep. Frank Lucas, the Republican nominee, against 28-year-old Dan Webber, the Democrat and former press secretary to Oklahoma Sen. David Boren (D). The district, one of three that includes part of Oklahoma City, heads north and mostly west, comprising over 25,000 square miles — about a third of the state's land area.

In presidential elections the district votes Republican: George Bush beat Michael Dukakis by 15 points in 1988 and Bill Clinton by almost 9 points in 1992 Down-ballot, though, the voting patterns are very different. English was re-elected routinely, and voting in gubernatorial and US Senate elections has pretty much mirrored the rest of the state.

This shouldn't be surprising, since the district includes everything from inner-city neighborhoods to prairie country. Thirty-four percent of the vote is in Oklahoma County (Oklahoma City), 12 percent in Garfield County (Enid), and the rest is spread among all or parts of 22 other counties.

Lucas led Webber by 11 points in a survey of 400 registered voters taken for his campaign by Cole, Snodgrass and Associ-

ates just after Lucas's April 5 runoff victory over state Sen. **Brooks Douglass**. Democrats dispute those numbers, saying that a survey of registered voters in a special election is totally inappropriate. They claim their own surveys show the race to be neckand-neck.

Lucas, who chairs the state House GOP Caucus, is counting on a high turnout from a lottery initiative that will also be on the ballot. That's because he does better with younger voters, who usually participate in lower numbers, while Webber does better among older voters, who cast their ballots come hell or high water.

Lucas-backers complain that Webber's candidacy is nothing more than a creation of Boren, suggesting that many other prominent Democrats wanted the nomination and would have sought it had they not been "muscled out" by the Senator, a political powerhouse in the state.

Business PAC directors are privately complaining about what they describe as very heavy pressure from the Senator to contribute to his protege — ironic, given Boren's strong opposition to PACs and frequent complaints about the influence of special interest money.

It's unlikely that Webber — who joined Boren's staff right out of college, has never sought public office, and moved back to the district where he was born and raised just in time to run — would be the nominee without the very active support of his old boss.

Democrats retort that Webber, who has worked on both agriculture and oil and gas issues for Boren, has earned his stripes on Capitol Hill every bit as much as Lucas has in the legislature. As for suggestions that Webber may be a little young for the job, one Democrat joked, "The other guy looks like he's 12, too."

Given the closeness of the race, politicos in the district are watching very closely to see if an action on Monday by Secretary of Labor Robert Reich will become a factor in the election.

According to the Daily Oklahoman, Reich arrived at the Dayton Tire plant in Oklahoma City Monday morning at 9:10 a.m. to deliver citations for \$7.5 million in OSHA violations, then went to court to seek an emergency injunction forcing the plant to comply immediately with federal safety

rules. The action effectively shut down the plant, which employs 1,100 hourly union workers and 350 to 400 salaried workers.

The citations were the result of an Oct. 19 accident at the plant in which a worker was fatally injured by a fire press. According to the Oklahoman, Reich received a report on the incident on Friday and decided to deliver the citations personally on Monday.

On Tuesday, a federal judge ordered the plant reopened over the objections of Labor

Department attorneys, who argued that continued operation would risk serious injuries to plant workers. The question is whether Reich's action will spill over into the Congressional race in the adjacent district.

The Daily Oklahoman, in a front-page news story, wrote: "What's worse, the action threatened more than 1,000 workers with the loss of some of the best-paying jobs in the state...."

Regardless of the facts, such an action and the resulting editorializing in front-page news stories in the only newspaper with statewide circulation could hurt Webber's efforts to identify himself as a David Boren-Glenn English Democrat and put the Clinton Administration more on people's minds.






