Purpose:

To tell him you have been talking to Paul Mifsud and Paul Russo concerning his involvement with issues development and wanted to get together with him in Ohio, but have been tied up in Washington with the Crime and Health Care Bills.

Ask him if "the three of you would consider coming to Washington within the next week or so," to follow up on the meeting you had with the two Pauls. You might mention you are aware that he is extremely concerned about "Unfunded Mandates," and give him a status report on legislation and offer to be helpful.

Background:

Governor Voinovich wants to get involved. He firmly believes that the Federal Government is crushing state governments and is therefore hurting people in places like Ohio. The Governor would like to know that he would have access to you on domestic issues and that he could be helpful in crafting a new Republican agenda.

Update

A survey conducted by Market Strategies May 19-25, found that Governor George Voinovich was supported by 60% of those polled and state Senator Robert Burch was supported by 19% (N= 606 registered voters statewide). A Political/Media Research poll conducted April 25-27 showed that Governor George Voinovich led state Senator Robert Burch 59% to 19% (N= 815 likely voters, margin of error +/- 3.5%).

Notwithstanding his high poll numbers, Governor Voinovich will continue to build on his successes and will aggressively take his record to the people of Ohio.

He has announced a new program to bring telecommunications and computer technology into Ohio elementary and high schools over the next 5 years. "Providing the new learning technologies is critical to improving Ohio schools." "SchoolNet" will allow students to receive many different types of educational resources, from experts in a given field to up-to-date information.

For the duration of the campaign, Governor Voinovich will remind voters of his many accomplishments. He will remind voters that in his term there have been four rounds of budget cuts totaling \$711 million. He will remind voters that because of his willingness to invest more resources toward low income families and children, Ohio is ranked first in the country in Head Start spending. Despite his successful efforts in reducing the rate of growth in overall state spending, Governor Voinovich has nonetheless received accolades from such notable authorities as Marian Wright Edelman for successful programs with families and children. Ohio was one of the earliest states to be recognized for achieving the six national education goals.

Governor Voinovich is running with a slate of candidates with a wealth of experience and records of achievement. Lieutenant Governor nominee Nancy Hollister was until February overseeing economic development, funding and policy issues for 29 southeastern rural Ohio counties as Governor Voinovich's Office of Appalachia Director. Recently appointed State Treasurer Ken Blackwell served in the Bush Administration and is the first African-American to hold a statewide non-judicial position.

Disgruntled ex-state employee Billy Inmon ended his hunger strike at least for the meantime, on August 30 after collapsing and being hospitalized on August 27. The independent gubernatorial candidate had been fasting to protest Governor Voinovich's refusal to debate him. Inmon had been fired by Voinovich as manager of the 1992 Ohio State Fair. During his tenure in that position, Inmon alienated several large sponsors, put several of his friends from Kentucky on the payroll and appointed another to a \$50,000 a year position (which had to be given up after the hire was accused of sexual harassment). While expressing compassion for Inmon's family the Governor was very direct about not in any way negotiating or debating with someone who was so clearly seeking publicity. He also has held the firm position that "a simple decision by me to capitulate would be widely interpreted as a sign that undue public antics can and will unduly influence me and my actions."

The Inmon story would not be so significant except that this minor candidate completely drowns out anything that Rob Burch is doing in the race. During the strike, Inmon often had twice as many reporters around him than did Burch. As the *Cincinnati Post* noted, "With Voinovich socking away more than \$6 million for this fall's campaign and his popularity rating at an all-time high among Ohioans, Democrats are conceding it's no contest and wasting little time or money on Burch."

POLITICAL UPDATE

- The Ohio political environment is presently favorable to Republicans. Popular Governor George Voinovich appears headed toward a big win; other statewide races are competitive, and Republicans have a good shot at taking over the state House of Representatives. Republicans already control the state Senate. A June public survey found Ohioans split on the job Bill Clinton is doing (Approve 50%/Disapprove 44%).
- **Mike DeWine** scored a surprisingly strong win over attractive challenger Bernadine Healy (52%-32%), despite being outspent by \$1 million. **DeWine** served one term in the Ohio Senate until 1982, when he was first elected to Congress. After winning election as Lt. Governor in 1990, he challenged John Glenn for the U.S. Senate and lost in 1992. Ohioans have a long history of electing previously defeated candidates to high office, however, with Voinovich being the most recent example.
- **Joel Hyatt** narrowly defeated Cuyahoga (Cleveland) County Commissioner Mary Boyle, despite his 2:1 money advantage and front-runner status. **Hyatt** founded Hyatt Legal Services, a chain of low fee law offices that developed a public image - substantially negative - for **Hyatt**, through his appearances in their many ads. **Hyatt** has been actively preparing his Senate bid for several years and is perceived to have been hand-picked by his father-in-law, Howard Metzenbaum. **Hyatt** is using Metzenbaum to raise money out of state. **DeWine** is using this issue to attack **Hyatt**, saying Metzenbaum is secretly orchestrating the campaign from behind-the-scenes.

- Press coverage has emphasized the chaos and disappointments of the **Hyatt** campaign, and at the end of June **Hyatt** sacked his handlers and renewed his political ties to Metzenbaum. Mandy Grunwald, media guru and Clinton advisor, was replaced with a team from Doak & Shrum, long-time Metzenbaum and Glenn consultants. Glenn and Metzenbaum have been named Honorary Co-Chairmen of the campaign, rallying the Democrat base and aiding fundraising, but undermining **Hyatt** attempts to portray himself as an outsider/reformer.
- **Hyatt** is attempting to run as a candidate in touch with women's issues, yet his actions are consistently contradictory. In the 1971, **Hyatt** fought to keep Dartmouth College all-male and even wrote an article in the Alumni magazine praising the "composition of its student body." In a period of 60 days, **Hyatt** fired his media consultant, campaign director and spokesperson - all three women; the three replacements were men.
- **Joe Slovenec (I)**, an ex-Operation Rescue leader, is starting to gain credibility in the Senate race in Ohio. **Slovenec** claims to have 3,500 volunteers and raised more than \$100,000. Last week, **Slovenec** ran TV and radio ads in Cincinnati, Columbus and Cleveland. This was good news for **Hyatt** because they believe that **Slovenec** is going to cut into **DeWine's** conservative base of support, especially to those who support the anti-abortion cause. As University of Akron's John Green stated, "**Slovenec** would dearly love to hurt both **DeWine** and **Hyatt**. His political views are a mix of libertarianism, isolationism and far-right conservatism. The mortar that holds it all together is a belief that the country is suffering from a 'moral decay' that neither Democrats nor Republicans are willing to address."
- **Hyatt** is trying to make abortion a major issue in the race while **DeWine** is trying to keep it low profile (**DeWine** is anti-abortion). **DeWine** has been attacked by **Hyatt** and **Joseph Slovenec (I)** for canceling a joint T.V. appearance when he found out that **Slovenec** was included. **Slovenec** claims, and is probably right, that he would take away from **DeWine's** conservative base. **Hyatt** is attacking **DeWine** for his opposition to the Equal Rights Amendment as well.
- **DeWine** can expect to receive considerable support from the popular governor. **DeWine** challenged **Hyatt** to defend his support for the Clinton health care plan, citing a study forecasting substantial job losses in Ohio if passed. To help shore up support in the Democrat strongholds of Cleveland and Youngstown, **DeWine** ran a introductory bio spot and a tough-on-crime spot.
- National political handicappers see this as a highly competitive race: The *Cook Political Report* (8/19) rates Ohio as a "Toss-up" and the latest *Rothenberg Political Report* (8/17) rates it as "Takeover Likely."

Abortion Foes Focus On U.S. Senate Race In Ohio

CLEVELAND (AP) - The U.S. Senate race in Ohio is important to activists on both sides of the abortion issue, but campaign representatives doubt the issue will greatly affect voters.

Lt. Gov. Mike DeWine, a Republican, and Democratic lawyer Joel Hyatt will face off Nov. 8 for the seat now held by incumbent Democrat Howard Metzenbaum, who is retiring.

Carol Long, political action director of the National Right to Life Committee, said Friday that DeWine represents one of the group's best chances to add a senator sympathetic to the anti-abortion cause.

She said the group's political action committee will endorse DeWine and offer him financial support of up to \$5,000, the legal maximum. She made her comments at the organization's annual convention in Houston.

National Right to Life gave DeWine 100 percent ratings during his eight years in the U.S. House. Hyatt has long supported the National Abortion and Reproductive Rights Action League and Planned Parenthood.

The National Abortion Rights Action League has promised to give Hyatt similarly aggressive support.

"When it comes to women's reproductive rights and freedoms, the DeWine-Hyatt race is one of the two most important in the country," said James Wagoner, NARAL vice president.

Melinda Swan, Hyatt's campaign director, said she doubts the abortion issue alone will deliver many votes. DeWine strategist Barry Bennett agreed.

"It just doesn't show up when you ask people what they're most concerned about," Bennett said. "You could go down a list of 50 issues and abortion doesn't come out."

Hyatt-DeWine race high on priority list

Democrats need to retain seats

Democratic strategists see the U.S. Senate race in Ohio between millionaire lawyer Joel Hyatt and Lt. Gov. Michael DeWine as crucial to preserving the party's edge in the U.S. Senate, the chairmen of both the state party and the Democratic National Committee said yesterday.

DNC Chairman David Wilhelm, a native of Athens, said the race between Democrat Hyatt and Republican DeWine is among its top 5 to 10 races nationally.

"Ohio is a very competitive bell-weather state and will continue to be in years to come," Wilhelm said. "It is a state where we want to fight to keep our edge."

Losing the party's 56-44 edge in the Senate would make Sen. John Glenn, D-Ohio, lose his chairmanship of the influential Governmental Affairs Committee, and would also elevate right-wing conservatives like Jesse Helms, R-N.C., and Strom Thurmond, R-S.C., to committee chairmanships, Ohio Democratic Party Chairman Harry Meshel said.

"That's a revival of the Klan at its worst," Meshel said.

Wilhelm and Meshel said Hyatt supported Democratic party goals of health care reform, deficit reduction and job creation, and bashed DeWine's congressional

votes against health care coverage for the unemployed, notifying workers of toxins at their jobs, and providing relief for people who lost homes through foreclosure.

"The key question voters need to ask is do we want to go back to 12 years of trickle-down economics and the Republican way of doing things," Wilhelm said.

DeWine spokeswoman Deb Fiddelke criticized the pair for "starting a negative campaign" by selectively attacking her boss' record.

"All they are trying to do is divert attention from Mike DeWine's expertise and record on crime versus Joel Hyatt's rhetoric," she said. "Joel Hyatt is behind, and he is dropping like a rock. The Democratic Party under David Wilhelm has lost every important race since Clinton took office. They are obviously scared and desperate about this one."

Wilhelm said polls that showed DeWine with an early edge were deceiving because most voters hadn't made up their minds.

He also said DeWine should not

expect to be pulled along on the coattails of an anticipated landslide victory by Republican Gov. George V. Voinovich because Ohio voters weren't afraid to vote a split ticket.

The Democratic Party expects to retain its 10-9 edge in Ohio's delegation to the House of Representatives, and maybe to pick up the seat currently held by Rep. Martin Hoke, R-10, of Lakewood, Wilhelm said.

"Frank Gaul is a very well-known candidate who will give us one of our best opportunities for winning a seat," said Wilhelm of the Cuyahoga County treasurer who is running against Hoke. "I think we will do much better than the pundits predict."

Meshel predicted the Republican strategy of running three county prosecutors against Reps. Sherrod Brown, D-13, of Lorain, Thomas Sawyer, D-14, of Akron, and Eric Fingerhut, D-19, of Mayfield Heights, won't hold up as other issues than crime take pre-eminence.

Hoke campaign manager Stuart Piper said the Democrats believed the 10th District seat "belongs to them by heredity" because it was held by Democrat Mary Rose Oakar for so long before Hoke defeated her last year.

"We believe that seat belongs to the people of the 10th District and we are looking forward to a tough, sharp campaign on the issues this fall," Piper said.

For Second Time In a Week, DeWine Ducks Debate

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) - Pity the independent candidates in the Nov. 8 election. Republicans won't tolerate them at debates.

For the second time in a week, Republican U.S. Senate candidate Mike DeWine on Thursday backed out of a proposed appearance with Democrat Joel Hyatt because sponsors also invited independent Joseph Slovenec.

The Hyatt campaign immediately charged that the decision reflects DeWine's fear of vulnerability on the abortion issue.

Hyatt is pro-choice. DeWine opposes abortion except in cases of rape, incest, or a threat to a woman's life. Slovenec opposes abortion under any circumstance.

All three want to succeed U.S. Sen. Howard Metzenbaum, D-Ohio, who is not seeking re-election. Metzenbaum has been a dependable abortion rights supporter.

"Mike DeWine is terrified that the women of Ohio will find out that he wants to take away their right to choose," said Dale Butland, Hyatt spokesman.

"The problem isn't that Mike DeWine doesn't want to debate Rev. Slovenec. The real problem is that he doesn't want to debate the women of Ohio," Butland said.

Barry Bennett, DeWine's campaign director, dismissed such accusations. Bennett said the Ohio and National Right to Life organizations both have endorsed DeWine.

"Mr. Slovenec takes a far right position in a lot of other things," Bennett said. "We want the debates to be debates and not World Wrestling Federation matches."

Hyatt is Metzenbaum's son-in-law. Slovenec is a former national leader of the anti-abortion group Operation Rescue. DeWine is lieutenant governor.

DeWine told Ohio Public Broadcasting on Thursday he would not participate in a planned debate with Hyatt after the group invited Slovenec.

Bennett said DeWine would take part in debates that include candidates who reach at least a 15 percent rating in independent public opinion polls.

Bennett said that is the standard that the League of Women Voters uses, and that DeWine would take part in that group's planned debate this fall.

Last week, DeWine withdrew from a proposed July 29 candidates forum in Parma because Slovenec was invited to participate.

Voinovich on Wednesday backed out of public broadcasting or any other debates that include independent governor candidate Billy Inmon.

A message for Slovenec was left on an answering machine at his campaign office in Cleveland.

At Dartmouth, Senate Candidate Opposed College Accepting Women

Democrat Joel Hyatt, a U.S. Senate candidate who touts his
women's rights positions, crusaded in 1971 against his college
accepting women.

Hyatt said in published reports today that he was wrong when, as
a student, he fought to keep Dartmouth College in Hanover, N.H.,
all male.

At that time, he wrote in an alumni magazine, "The uniqueness
of the Dartmouth experience certainly stems from the composition of
its student body. The Dartmouth fellowship is a product of the
closeness of men who live together and learn together."

Despite Hyatt's efforts, Dartmouth became coeducational in 1972,
the year he graduated. In 1991, women made up 43 percent of the
student body.

"Immediately after Dartmouth went coeducational I came to see
it was a tremendous benefit for Dartmouth and for the students
participating in a coeducational environment," Hyatt, of
Cleveland, said Wednesday. "Adding women to campus helped enrich
the experience that Dartmouth male students had in a way that I
didn't see as a kid when I wrote the article."

Hyatt said he does not think his college stand on coeducation
takes away from his assertion that he is the candidate best for
women. He is the Democratic nominee in the Nov. 8 election to
succeed Sen. Howard Metzenbaum, who is retiring and is Hyatt's
father-in-law.

Hyatt spokesman Dale Butland attacked the Republican candidate,
Mike DeWine, for his stand on issues involving women. DeWine
opposes abortion in most circumstances and voted against the Equal
Rights Amendment as a congressman.

"Mike DeWine voted against the ERA when he was in Congress, not
when he was in college, and if Mike DeWine had his way, women still
wouldn't have the right to choose, not just where to go to college,
but whether or not to bear children," Butland said.

Barry Bennett, DeWine's campaign manager, said Hyatt has a
"disturbing pattern" of attacking his foe at the same time he is
admitting a mistake.

Bennett accused Hyatt's law firm of having a poor record of
promoting women to top positions.

"The picture is getting clearer - Joel Hyatt's rhetoric and his
actions are very different," Bennett said. "Mike DeWine had
nothing to do with Joel Hyatt's position on keeping Dartmouth all
male."

Bennett said DeWine is personally opposed to abortion. He said
DeWine would have voted for the ERA if language had been included
giving women the right to opt out of the military draft and combat
and allowing Congress to withhold federal funding for abortions.

Joseph Slovenec is running for the Senate seat as an
independent.

Messages left today with all three candidates were not
immediately returned.

DeWine Schedules LA Fund-Raiser After Criticizing Hyatt's
Out-of-State Contributions

U.S. Senate candidate Mike DeWine has scheduled a fund-raiser in Los Angeles, after criticizing an opponent for raising too much money out of the state.

DeWine, a Republican, last month criticized Democrat Joel Hyatt for raising more than 50 percent of his campaign money in other states. DeWine in September plans to attend a fund-raiser in California that is being organized in part by Rupert Murdoch, chairman of Fox Inc.

"Once again, we see that if hypocrisy were art, Michael DeWine would be Michelangelo," Hyatt spokesman Dale Butland told The (Cleveland) Plain Dealer for a story published today.

DeWine, Hyatt and independent Joseph Slovenec are running Nov. 8 for the seat of Hyatt's father-in-law, Democrat Howard Metzenbaum, who is retiring.

DeWine spokesman Barry Bennett today defended the California trip.

"In order to be competitive, we're going to have to hold some fund-raisers around the country," Bennett said. "We don't think it's right, we don't think it's legal, but we have to stay competitive."

Bennett said about 7 percent of DeWine's campaign funds have come from outside Ohio.

Bennett told The Plain Dealer that he believes that by Election Day, DeWine will have raised a greater percentage of his campaign funds from Ohioans than will Hyatt.

"It's unfortunate that people from outside Ohio, people who don't live here, some of whom have never even been here, are going to affect this election," Bennett said.

Butland did not return a phone message seeking additional comment today.

Report: DeWine Lobbied for Inmon

DAYTON, Ohio (AP) - Lt. Gov. Mike DeWine lobbied to have Billy Inmon hired as manager of the 1992 Ohio State Fair, the Dayton Daily News reported today.

The revelation comes as Gov. George Voinovich has tried to distance himself from the decision to hire Inmon.

Inmon, an independent candidate for governor, has been living on a bench outside the Statehouse in Columbus since beginning a fast Aug. 1 to protest Voinovich's refusal to debate him.

DeWine said he lobbied the 11-member Ohio Expositions Commission at Inmon's request.

"I called two or three members," Dewine said Wednesday. "I said, 'Here's a guy who could get things done, who was reliable and who was a very hard worker.'"

DeWine said he could not remember if he was aware of any concerns about Inmon's qualifications when he lobbied on his behalf.

Gov. George Voinovich said Wednesday that he was "not in favor of Billy being hired ... The mistake I made was that I didn't reach out and say, 'Please don't select him.'"

Voinovich spokesman Mike Dawson today said DeWine's support for Inmon was reported at the time DeWine made the calls.

Voinovich conceded that other members of his administration lobbied for Inmon, a Willard businessman, the newspaper said.

Under Ohio law, the fair manager is hired by the Expositions Commission - a panel whose members are appointed by the governor. The panel historically has selected fair managers who have the governor's support.

Inmon inherited a fair plagued by financial problems, but the problems worsened during his tenure. A series of controversies ultimately led to his ouster. At Voinovich's urging, the commission fired Inmon in 1992.

USDA REORGANIZATION... This legislation will close approximately 1200 field offices nation wide and save the government close to \$1 billion over 5 years. The bill has passed the Senate twice now but has not passed the House. However, the House will take up the bill during Conference of crop insurance since USDA Reorganization was attached. Kansas will lose 2-5 offices.

CRP... Most farmer callers want to know if the Conservation Reserve Program will be extended. Predictions now assume that the program will be extended in some form. There may be fewer acres and those acres may be targeted to environmentally sensitive areas (waterways, ponds, etc...) Also, the payment rate will most likely be less due to budget constraints.

CROP INSURANCE REFORM... Crop insurance reform has now passed the House and Senate and they will go to Conference when Congress comes back. The package is lean and mean. Under reform, disaster programs are eliminated. Instead, that money (approximately \$1 billion annually) is put towards the crop insurance program. The funds are used to buy down premium increases in the out years. We will watch this package closely as it moves through Conference.

MARKETS... The big news is hogs dropped between \$3-\$4.50 this week mostly due to high supply going into Labor Day. Hogs are now around \$39. Break even for good producers is \$38. Cattle are around \$67. Crops were mostly steady with some concern that USDA has overestimated crop production. A crop report is due out on September 12.

FARM BILL... This will be debated in 1995. There will be 3 driving factors. Environment, budget, and urban politics. You should be aware that there is a strong move to reauthorize the Farm Bill in the GATT implementing legislation. You are on record opposing loading GATT up with such items as dairy. However, if the Administration includes dairy, then it may be worth taking a look at the Farm Bill. USTR and USDA are looking at the legalities of doing this. If we were to revert back to Farm Bill standing authorization, that would be the 1949 Act which is GATT illegal. **BOTTOM LINE**—we are taking a close look at all the options. However, Senator Leahy has so far refused to mark up GATT implementing language.

GREEN BOX... The Administration is charging agriculture \$1.7 billion to pay for GATT. Agriculture is claiming their fair share is around \$800 million. The ag groups would like the difference to be put towards GATT legal programs or green box. These include the Market Promotion Program, Foreign Market Development, and TEFAP. You did not sign a letter supporting these efforts since the ag groups have not come up with offsets.

EEP... Funding was cut by \$150 million in the Senate so total EEP spending is \$850 million. We must now go to Conference with the House to determine a final spending level. You have supported efforts to spend EEP to the maximum allowable level.
