

THE UNITED STATES CONFERENCE OF MAYORS DEFERRED COMPENSATION PROGRAM

The United States Conference of Mayors began to offer its deferred compensation program in 1979.

To date, over 2,500 cities have adopted the program.

The U.S. Conference of Mayors Deferred Compensation Program permits each participating employee, at no cost to the city, to postpone paying Federal income taxes on both the money deferred into the program and on what that money earns.

The program allows eligible employees to defer up to 25 percent of their salaries and to place that money instead in any single or combination of 16 various investment options, including a secure account which offers a guaranteed rate of return.

The amount of salary deferred is deducted directly from an employee's gross income, which means the employee pays current taxes on the reduced amount. Income taxes on the amount deferred plus earnings aren't payable until the employee actually withdraws the money. Usually that's after retirement, when the employee's tax bracket is likely to be lower.

The U.S. Conference of Mayors developed this plan for city employees in cooperation with the Public Employees Benefit Services Corporation (PEBSCO). They act as the Conference of Mayors' staff in servicing the Deferred Compensation Program.

We hope that you and your city will give serious consideration to this program.

THANK YOU. IT'S A PLEASURE TO BE HERE. I HAVE TO TELL YOU THAT FOR A MOMENT OR SO ON **TUESDAY NIGHT, I WONDERED IF** THE PRESIDENT WOULD FINISH IN TIME FOR ME TO BE HERE THIS MORNING. AS I SAID YESTERDAY, **IF THE PRESIDENT PAYS HIS**

SPEECHWRITERS BY THE WORD, WE'LL NEVER BALANCE THE BUDGET.

REST ASSURED THAT I WON'T KEEP YOU THAT LONG THIS MORNING. I WAS THINKING ON THE WAY OVER THIS MORNING THAT I'VE HAD THE PRIVILEGE OF MEETING WITH THE CONFERENCE **OF MAYORS ON MANY OCCASIONS-**-BUT THIS TIME IS DIFFERENT. THIS

IS THE FIRST TIME I'VE BEEN ABLE TO WELCOME YOU TO A WASHINGTON, D.C. WHERE BOTH THE HOUSE AND SENATE WERE CONTROLLED BY REPUBLICANS. AND I'M REMINDED OF THE FAMOUS STORY ABOUT ANOTHER **OCCASION WHEN REPUBLICANS CONTROLLED BOTH HOUSES OF** CONGRESS, AND A DEMOCRAT **PRESIDENT--GROVER CLEVELAND--A** FORMER MAYOR OF BUFFALO--WAS SERVING IN THE WHITE HOUSE. ONE NIGHT, CLEVELAND'S WIFE HEARD SOME NOISES FROM DOWNSTAIRS, AND SHE SAID, "WAKE UP, I THINK THERE ARE SOME BURGLARS IN THE HOUSE."

AND CLEVELAND SUPPOSEDLY REPLIED, "NO, NO MY DEAR. IN THE SENATE, MAYBE, BUT NOT IN THE HOUSE."

STROM THURMOND, WHO WAS IN THE SENATE AT THAT TIME, STILL HASN'T FORGIVEN PRESIDENT **CLEVELAND FOR THAT REMARK.** WELL, YOU ARE IN WASHINGTON AT A VERY EXCITING AND HISTORIC TIME. FOR THE FIRST TIME IN A LONG, LONG TIME, WE TRULY HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO GIVE **GOVERNMENT BACK TO THE** PEOPLE.

THIS IS A MESSAGE THAT I KNOW MAKES SENSE TO AMERICA'S MAYORS, REGARDLESS OF YOUR PARTY.

LIKE MILLIONS OF AMERICANS, I GREW UP IN A SMALL TOWN. BACK IN RUSSELL, KANSAS, GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND THE CITIZENS THEY WERE SERVING KNEW EACH OTHER. THEY WERE NEIGHBORS TO EACH OTHER, WENT

TO THE SAME HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL GAMES, AND RAN INTO EACH OTHER AT THE LOCAL DRUG STORE. RUSSELL OFFICIALS KNEW WHAT THE PEOPLE OF RUSSELL NEEDED, AND THEY WERE ABLE TO MEET THOSE NEEDS.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MEETING LOCAL NEEDS--THAT'S A FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLE OF GOOD GOVERNMENT. AND IT'S A

PRINCIPLE THAT IS VIOLATED EACH AND EVERY DAY HERE IN WASHINGTON.

THE FIRST STEP TO REINING IN **GOVERNMENT AND MEETING THE NEEDS OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE IS** THE BILL I DESIGNATED AS S.1--LEGISLATION TO PUT AN END TO UNFUNDED MANDATES. I KNOW I'M PREACHING TO A **REVIVAL MEETING ON THIS TOPIC,**

BUT I DO WANT TO QUOTE FROM A **RECENT WALL STREET JOURNAL ARTICLE BY MAYOR GREG** LASHUTKA OF COLUMBUS, WHICH SUMMARIZES THE PROBLEM YOU HAVE FACED FOR FAR TOO LONG. "COLUMBUS ESTIMATED ITS TOTAL SPENDING ON 14 MAJOR **ENVIRONMENTAL (UNFUNDED)** MANDATES WOULD BE \$1.6 BILLION FROM 1991 TO 2000. EACH

COLUMBUS FAMILY'S SHARE, **REFLECTED PRIMARILY IN WATER** AND SEWER BILLS, WOULD BE \$850 A YEAR. THIS AMOUNTS TO A MASSIVELY REGRESSIVE HIDDEN TAX THAT HITS FAMILIES AND RETIRED PEOPLE ESPECIALLY HARD."

GREG IS EXACTLY RIGHT. A MANDATE IS A TAX. IT'S A TAX ON THE CITIES AND TOWNS YOU LEAD. IT'S A TAX ON ALL THE BUSINESSES IN YOUR CITIES. AND IT'S A TAX ON ALL THE RESIDENTS, AS WELL. AS YOU KNOW, S. 1 HAS BEEN ON THE SENATE FLOOR FOR A COUPLE OF WEEKS, NOW. PRESIDENT CLINTON SAID HE SUPPORTS IT. MOST OF THE DEMOCRATS IN THE SENATE SAY THEY SUPPORT IT. YET THEY'VE **BEEN DELAYING THE BILL FOR**

WEEKS, REPUBLICANS KNOW A LITTLE BIT ABOUT DELAY, AS WELL. BUT AT LEAST WE WERE TRYING TO STOP BILLS THAT WE OPPOSED. WE ARE GOING TO STAY ON THIS BILL UNTIL IT'S FINISHED--WHETHER THAT'S MIDNIGHT TONIGHT, OR **MIDNIGHT TOMORROW, OR** WHENEVER. IF YOU HAVE SOME FREE TIME, I HOPE YOU'LL DROP BY THE OFFICE OF YOUR SENATOR--

ESPECIALLY THOSE WHO CO-SPONSORED IT, AND WHO ARE NOW STALLING.

AND WHEN THIS BILL IS PASSED AND SIGNED INTO LAW, EACH AND EVERY MAYOR SHOULD SEND A **KEY TO YOUR CITY TO DIRK KEMPTHORNE. WHEN HE CAME TO** THE SENATE TWO YEARS AGO. FRESH FROM SERVING AS MAYOR OF BOISE, HE MADE THIS ISSUE HIS

#1 PRIORITY, AND HE'S KEPT IT THERE EVER SINCE.

BUT PASSAGE OF S. 1 IS JUST A START. THERE ARE OTHER AREAS, AS WELL, WHERE WE WILL RETURN POWER TO STATE AND LOCAL LEVELS. THAT INCLUDES WELFARE REFORM AND CRIME.

I KNOW THAT THE PRESIDENT OF YOUR CONFERENCE, MAYOR ASHE, TESTIFIED BEFORE THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE LAST WEEK **ON CRIME LEGISLATION, AND HE** HIT THE NAIL ON THE HEAD. LOCAL **OFFICIALS KNOW THEIR NEEDS BEST, AND THEY ARE DIFFERENT IN** EVERY CITY. SO ANY FEDERAL **ASSISTANCE WE SEND YOUR WAY TO COMBAT CRIME WILL COME** WITH AS FEW STRINGS ATTACHED AS POSSIBLE. WE'LL LET YOU **DECIDE WHETHER OR NOT YOU**

WANT TO USE THE MONEY TO HIRE AND TRAIN NEW OFFICERS, OR TO PURCHASE HIGH-TECH EQUIPMENT. ALONG WITH PUTTING AN END TO UNFUNDED MANDATES, AND TREATING CITIES AND STATES AS PARTNERS, RATHER THAN SERVANTS OF BIG BROTHER, THERE IS A THIRD STEP THE 104TH **CONGRESS WILL TAKE--AND THAT'S DIGGING THE AMERICAN PEOPLE**

OUT FROM UNDER AN AVALANCHE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS. AND NO DOUBT ABOUT IT, IT WILL TAKE A LOT OF DIGGING AND A LOT OF SHOVELS.

I DON'T USUALLY RECOMMEND BOOKS, BUT THERE IS ONE I THINK SHOULD BE REQUIRED READING FOR EVERY SENATOR, CONGRESSMAN AND FEDERAL BUREAUCRAT.

IT'S A LITTLE BOOK CALLED "THE DEATH OF COMMON SENSE," BY PHILIP HOWARD, I BROUGHT ALONG A COPY, AND AS YOU CAN SEE, IT'S SHORT, AND YOU SHOULD **BE ABLE TO FINISH IT IN ONE** SITTING. COME TO THINK OF IT, YOU PROBABLY COULD HAVE READ THE ENTIRE BOOK DURING PRESIDENT CLINTON'S STATE OF

THE UNION SPEECH THE OTHER NIGHT.

THE BOOK DESCRIBES HOW WE HAVE REACHED A POINT IN OUR SOCIETY WHERE GOVERNMENT **RULES AND REGULATIONS CONTROL ALMOST EVERY ACTIVITY OF COMMON INTEREST--FROM** FIXING THE POTHOLE IN FRONT OF THE HOUSE, TO RUNNING PUBLIC SCHOOLS, TO REGULATING DAY

CARE CENTERS, TO CONTROLLING BEHAVIOR IN THE WORKPLACE, TO CLEANING UP THE ENVIRONMENT. AND IN THE PROCESS, WE HAVE LEFT NO ROOM FOR COMMON SENSE.

LET ME GIVE YOU JUST TWO EXAMPLES:

*MOTHER TERESA AND THE NUNS OF THE MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY WANTED TO TURN AN **ABANDONED BUILDING IN NEW** YORK CITY INTO A HOMELESS SHELTER--AND THEY WERE READY TO SPEND \$500,000 FOR THE NECESSARY RECONSTRUCTION. THE ONLY UNUSUAL THING ABOUT THEIR PLAN WAS THAT THE NUNS, IN ADDITION TO THEIR VOW OF POVERTY, AVOID THE USE OF MODERN CONVENIENCES.

MOTHER TERESA IS A REMARKABLE WOMAN. BUT SHE IS NOT MATCH FOR DETERMINED BUREAUCRATS. NEW YORK'S **BUILDING CODE REQUIRES AN ELEVATOR IN EVERY NEW OR** RENOVATED MULTIPLE-STORY **BUILDING, AND DESPITE THE FACT** THAT THE MISSIONARIES OF **CHARITY WOULD NEVER USE THE ELEVATOR BECAUSE OF THEIR**

BELIEFS, THEY WERE TOLD THAT THE LAW WOULD NOT BE WAIVED, AND IF THEY WANTED A SHELTER, THEY WOULD HAVE TO INSTALL A \$100,000 ELEVATOR.

MOTHER TERESA GAVE UP, CANCELED THE PROJECT, AND SPENT THE \$100,000 ON SOUP AND SANDWICHES FOR THE POOR. NOW, COMMON SENSE WOULD SUGGEST THAT A HOMELESS

SHELTER WITHOUT AN ELEVATOR IS BETTER THAN NO HOMELESS SHELTER AT ALL. BUT THE LAW LEFT NO ROOM FOR COMMON SENSE.

*ANOTHER EXAMPLE: AN OSHA INSPECTOR VISITING A BRICK FACTORY IN READING, PENNSYLVANIA NOTED THAT THE DUSTMASK WORN BY A WORKER WITH A BEARD WAS VIOLATING

THE RULE THAT REQUIRES A CLOSE FIT BETWEEN FACE AND MASK. THE DUST WAS NOT HEAVY OR OF HAZARDOUS CONTENT. AND THE MASK, EVEN WORN OVER A BEARD, FILTERED OUT MOST OF WHAT THERE WAS. BUT THE RULE WAS CLEAR. THE WORKER WAS **GIVEN THE OPTION OF SHAVING HIS** BEARD OR QUITTING. GIVEN THE FACT THAT HE WAS AMISH, AND

SHAVING WOULD VIOLATE HIS **RELIGIOUS CONVICTION, HE QUIT.** AGAIN, A LITTLE COMMON SENSE HERE WOULD HAVE LED TO A DIFFERENT RESULT. THE POINT IS THIS. OUR **REGULATORY SYSTEM HAS BECOME** AN INSTRUCTION MANUAL. IT **TELLS BUREAUCRATS EXACTLY** WHAT TO DO AND HOW TO DO IT. **DETAILED RULE AFTER DETAILED**

RULE ADDRESSES EVERY EVENTUALITY, OR AT LEAST EVERY SITUATION THAT LAWMAKERS AND BUREAUCRATS CAN THINK OF. WE HAVE LEFT NO ROOM FOR INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITY. AND NO ROOM FOR COMMON SENSE. AND DESPITE THE RHETORIC COMING FROM THE CLINTON **ADMINISTRATION ABOUT** "REINVENTING GOVERNMENT," ALL

WE ARE REALLY GETTING IS MORE "UNRELENTING GOVERNMENT." FOR EACH OF THE FIRST TWO YEARS OF THIS ADMINISTRATION, THE NUMBER OF PAGES OF ACTUAL **REGULATIONS AND NOTICES** PUBLISHED IN THE FEDERAL **REGISTER EXCEEDED ANY YEAR** SINCE THE CARTER ADMINISTRATION.

I BELIEVE THAT THE SUCCESS OF THIS CONGRESS WON'T BE JUDGED BY HOW MANY LAWS AND **REGULATIONS WE PASS, IT WILL BE** JUDGED ON HOW MANY **REGULATIONS WE CUT, AND HOW** MUCH GOVERNMENT AND POWER WE GIVE BACK TO LOCAL **GOVERNMENT AND TO THE** AMERICAN PEOPLE.

IN THAT REGARD, HOUSE **REPUBLICANS HAVE INTRODUCED** LEGISLATION WHICH WOULD PLACE A SIX MONTH MORATORIUM ON THE 4,300 NEW FEDERAL **REGULATIONS THE CLINTON ADMINISTRATION HAS PROPOSED** SINCE THE DAY AFTER THE **ELECTION. BEFORE INTRODUCING** THIS LEGISLATION, THE REPUBLICAN CONGRESSIONAL

LEADERSHIP WROTE A LETTER TO THE PRESIDENT, REQUESTING SUCH A MORATORIUM, AND HE REFUSED. I WILL ALSO INTRODUCE LEGISLATION SOON THAT WILL INSIST THAT FEDERAL AGENCIES TAKE INTO ACCOUNT THE COSTS, AS WELL AS THE BENEFITS, OF **REGULATIONS. AND IT WILL INSIST** THAT AGENCIES USE ONLY "SOUND SCIENCE"WHEN MEASURING RISKS.

IN CLOSING, LET ME SHARE WITH YOU WHAT HAPPENS WHEN THE RULE BOOK IS REPLACED BY COMMON SENSE. IN THE DAYS **AFTER THE 1994 LOS ANGELES** EARTHQUAKE, CALIFORNIA **GOVERNOR PETE WILSON** SUSPENDED THE THICK BOOK OF **PROCEDURAL GUIDELINES, AND** WITH FEDERAL AID, AUTHORIZED FINANCIAL INCENTIVES FOR SPEEDY WORK. AND INSTEAD OF WHAT MIGHT HAVE BEEN A FOUR YEAR PROCESS, THE SANTA MONICA FREEWAY WAS REBUILT IN 61 DAYS.

CALIFORNIA DISCOVERED THAT WHEN THE RULE BOOK WAS TOSSED OUT, ALL THAT WAS LEFT WAS RESPONSIBILITY. RESPONSIBILITY. NOW, THERE'S A WORD WE DON'T HEAR TOO OFTEN **AROUND HERE. STATE OFFICIALS TOOK RESPONSIBILITY FOR DECIDING WHICH CONTRACTORS** WOULD BE ALLOWED TO BID, AND THEY KNEW THEY WOULD BE **ACCOUNTABLE IF THE CONTRACTORS PROVED** UNRELIABLE. **INSTEAD OF SPECIFYING EVERY IRON ROD, STATE INSPECTORS**

TOOK RESPONSIBILITY FOR

CHECKING TO MAKE SURE THAT THE WORK COMPLIED WITH **GENERAL STANDARDS. WHEN DISAGREEMENTS OCCURRED**, CONTRACTORS AND STATE BUREAUCRATS WORKED THEM OUT, JUST AS IF THEY WERE REAL PEOPLE.

LESS GOVERNMENT. FEWER REGULATIONS. NO UNFUNDED MANDATES. GIVING LOCAL **OFFICIALS RESPONSIBILITY, AND** NOT JUST RULES AND **REGULATIONS. DUSTING OFF THE 10TH AMENDMENT AND RESTORING** IT TO THE CONSTITUTION. THAT'S A FORMULA FOR A BETTER AND FREER AMERICA, AND THAT IS THE **OVERRIDING GOAL OF 104TH** CONGRESS. WORKING WITH AMERICA'S GOVERNORS, AND

AMERICA'S MAYORS, IT IS A GOAL THAT WE WILL REACH.
