#### BACKGROUND ON RENEW

#### Mission Statement

**RENEW** was founded in 1993 to recruit, train and fund Republican women candidates in local, state and federal elections. With members in 43 states, and founded on the belief that GOP women bring a distinct and vital approach to governance, it is the only national organization of either party that does so without regard to any single issue.

#### Philosophy

- \* RENEW is an organization of women and men dedicated to electing more Republican women on the local, state and national levels.
- \* RENEW has no "litruus test" except to elect Republican women candidates. RENEW recognizes the diversity of opinion and the wide variety of political beliefs among the women we support and we never attempt to influence their politics. By staying away from sir gle issue debates, we can work on our singular goal -- making sure that our Republican ideas, so utions, and principles are more strongly represented at all levels of government.
- RENEW never works against an incumbent Republican -- male or female; and, RENEW will
  not choose one Republican women over another when two or more are running for the same
  office;
- \* RENEW works at all levels, with an emphasis on recruiting and supporting Republican women for state and local offices. RENEW offers a training, information and networking resource upon which Republican women can draw. RENEW utilizes the talents of Republican office holders, as well as business and community leaders.
- RENEW members care about electing more Republican women to public office. REN.EW works to win.

#### Structure

**RENEW** is a non-affiliated political action committee based in Alexandria, Virginia, which conducts activities in support of Republican women candidates in Federal and non-Federal (state and local) elections throughout the United States.

**RENEW's** Federal activities are supported with funds which are subject to the regulations and guidelines of the Federal Election Commission pursuant to the Federal Election Campaign Act. Contributions in support of Federal candidates are accepted from individuals, PACs (corporate and political) in the amount of \$5000 per person or entity annually. Contributions are not to exceed the individual's \$25,000 annual Federal giving limit. Corporations and individuals may make un imited contributions to support the **RENEW** non-Federal account which supports state and local candidates when regulations permit corporate funds.

#### Organization

The following groups assist RENEW in reaching its goal of electing more Republican women:

- \* National Advisory Committee consisting of distinguished Republican women and man who have served their country in an elective or appointed position, the members of this group serve as advisors to *RENEW* and as spokesmen for the organization. They also assist in functraising efforts.
- \* Leadership Council led by two members of the Republican National Committee, this group is establishing a national network of advisors to help introduce *RENEW* across the country and to assist in identifying and supporting candidates.
- \* National Finance Committee consists of a group of distinguished individuals with proven fundraising abilities and enthusiasm. An immediate goal of the Finance Committee is to increase the number of *RENEW* Charter members (\$1000 or above).
- ★ Executive Committee is a working group of professionals who each chair a volunteer committee and meet monthly to plan and implement RENEW activities. Current vol..nteer committees are Candidate Endorsements, Candidate Services, Mentoring, Communications, Policy/Issues, Polling/Research, Membership, Events, and Training/Recruitment.

### SUMMARY OF RENEW ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Key RENEW Actions in First Year and a Half;

- \* Supported 60 candidates at local, state and federal levels, 42 of whom won;
- Commissioned Public Opinion Strategies to conduct two major national polls: (1) in late 1993, surveyed 800 individuals to determine who considers running for public office. Poll results indicate need for an organization like RENEW to encourage and assist GOP women; and (2) second POS national poll (800) in early 1994 evaluated the gender impact on image and electability of Republican women candidates, especially with Democrat and Independent "cross-over" voters;
- Surveyed all 3100 Republican state legislators to learn about the needs of first time condidates and to seek candidate mentors;
- Provided technical assistance to women candidates including fundraising assistance, media training, surrogate speakers, campaign volunteers, and mentoring;
- Commenced aggressive and comprehensive fundraising efforts including direct mail, events, and direct solicitation of individuals, corporations and PACs. National Finance Committee and Charter Member program initiated;
- Hosted several major fundraisers honoring candidates and newly elected Republican women.
   Each event averaged over 300 guests and several dozen members of Congress, including the participation of all of the incumbent Republican women, Senate Majority Leader Dole, Speaker Gingrich, Senator Phil Gramm, Cong. Bill Paxon and others;
- \* Members in 43 states. Approximately 40% of RENEW's members are men;
- \* Established most up-to-date and accurate women's candidate database in Washington;
- Communicate regularly with representatives of other women's political organizations (ie. National Women's Political Caucus, National Federation of Republican Women, WISH List, Women's Campaign Fund, Republican committees) to review candidates and encourage support from non-GOP groups;
- Pro-actively sought media attention for RENEW and GOP women candidates and off ceholders resulting in over 80 mentions or articles in national media including "The Washington Post,"
   "CBS This Morning," "Good Morning America," "The McLaughlin Group," "The National Journal," "Christian Science Monitor," "Dallas Morning News," "Houston Post," "Fox Morning News," "Campaigns & Elections," "C-SPAN," and "Working Woman."
