Dear Senator Dole:

Thank you for accepting our invitation to speak to our lows Tazpayers' Day meeting on Saturday, September 23.

This is the annual meeting of lowers for Tex Relief, lowe's nonpartisan taxpayer organization with more than 51,000 members. National Taxpayers Union is co-sponsoring this event.

Our organization limits its activities to the issues of taxes, government spending and debt, and limited government. Our members and the taxpayers of lows want to hear your specific stands on these issues.

We recognize there are many other important issues, but they are outside out эсора.

Therefore, we respectfully request that in your speech to our lowe Taxpayers' Day meeting, speak only on the issues of taxes, government spending and debt, and limited government. Please refrain from speaking on other issues, because of the limited scope of this event.

We also request; in your speech, please state your specific stand on these specific issues:

- Balanced Budget Amendment to U.S. Constitution. Do you support this Amendment as the House passed it earlier this year? Do you favor 1. any change in ht? As President, what will you do to help get it passed and ratified?
- Tex Limitation Amendment to U.S. Constitution: 3/5 Vote. Do you support a Constitutional Amendment to require a roll-call vote of 3/5 of all 2.

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members of each House of Congress to increase any federal tax or adopt any new federal tax? Do you favor any exception or additional provision? As President, what will you do to help get it passed and ratified?

- 3. Revenue and Spending Limit Amendment to U.S. Constitution. Do you support a Constitutional Amendment to limit the growth rate of total federal revenue and total federal spending to the rate of inflation plus population growth, unless a specific excess amount is approved by roll-call vote of 3/5 of all members of each House of Congress? Do you favor any other exception or additional provision? As President, what will you do to help get it passed and ratified?
- 4. Line-Item Veto Amendment to U.S. Constitution. Do you support a Constitutional Amendment to give the President a line-item veto on all appropriations bills? Do you favor any exception or additional provision? Should it include the option to reduce a line item? As President, what will you do to help get it passed and ratified?
- 5. When and How to Balance the Budget. Will you work to eliminate the federal deficit and balance the budget by a specific fiscal year? If so, what year? How do you plan to eliminate the annual deficit? Will you balance the budget solely by spending control, or will you consider revenue increases? What actions to control entitlements will you support? Which specific federal spending and programs will you control in each of these ways: (1) cut the dollar amount, (2) freeze the dollar amount, (3) limit growth to the rate of inflation, or (4) reduce the growth rate in some other way? Please be very specific.
- 6. Payment of the Federal Debt. After the budget is balanced, will you work to reduce the federal debt? If so, how? Pay down the debt at how fast a rate?
- 7. National Sales Tax. Do you support a national sales tax as a complete replacement for the federal income tax system? If so, should it be a retail sales tax or a European-style value added tax? What exemptions should be allowed? What tax rate would be necessary to replace the income tax?
- 8. Flat-Rate Income Tax. Do you support replacing the current federal income tax (personal, or corporation, or both) with a single flat-rate income tax? If so, what income should be subject to this tax and what should be exempt? What personal exemption amounts for taxpayers and dependents should be allowed? What deductions, if any, should be allowed? What tax rate would be necessary to replace the current income tax?
- 9. Other Changes in Federal Income Tax. Until the current federal Income tax is replaced, what changes in it do you support? In addition, please state your stand on each of these proposals:
 - a. Increase the personal exemption for each taxpayer and each child. How much?

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- Reduce federal income tax rates. How much? In all brackets, or some? b.
- Reduce or eliminate the tax on capital gains. Restore a partial exclusion for 0. capital gaine? Index the cost basis for capital gains?
- Restore the IRA option for all topayers, and allow a full \$2,000 IRA for a spouse d. not working outside the home.
- Restore the deduction for state and local sales taxes. 4 0.
- Restore the charitable deduction for taxpayers who don't itemize their other ſ.. deductions.
- Repeal the current provisions that take away deductions and exemptions at g. certain income levels.
- Federal Estate Tax. What changes in the federal estate and gift taxes do you 10. support? Should the current exemption amount be raised, lowered, or stay the same?

IOWANS FOR TAX RELIEF

7. National Sales Tax

Every industrialized country that has a VAT or a national sales tax also has an income tax. Since Americans are already overtaxed, I don;'t believe we should add a new tax system to the current one -- especially since the current one it too complicated, forcing taxpayers to use either an accountant or a lawyer or both just to file their tax return.

Valued-added taxes are typically more burdensome on the lower income since they pay a higher percentage of their income on consumption. It you exempt food, medical care, etc., then the rate has to be very high.

8. Flat tax

The Armey bill is the pure Hall-Rabushka model from 1981. The 1986 Act attempted to get there and got close. Few deductions remain for most individuals, but many believe that the rich pay little or no tax because they can take advantage of loopholes.

A single-rate system, like Armey, will shift the tax burden to the middle class because they will lose their mortgage interest, charitable, and state income and property tax deductions and not gain much by the lower rate.

The Armey plan would lose billions of dollars if it set the rate at about 20%.

Under a flat rate plan families earning up to about \$30,000 should pay little or no federal income tax.

9. Other changes in the federal income tax

- a. <u>Personal exemption increase</u>: The \$500 per child tax credit we expect to pass this year is effectively a very large increase in the personal exemption for children. The current tax law is not pro-family enough and should be changed to that families retain more of their earnings.
- b. Reduce federal income tax rates: I support repealing the Clinton and Bush tax increases from 1990 and 1993, both of which either directly or indirectly raised tax rates for individuals.
- c. Reduce or eliminate the capital gains tax; indexing; partial exclusion: We should cut the capital gains tax and look to eliminating it entirely. It is an obstacle to capital formation, entrepreneurship and economic growth. The current system taxes capital twice and at a minimum we need to eliminate this double taxation.

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As far as indexing goes, the experts are split. Some think the complexity outweighs the benefits and others disagree. In a pure system it makes sense, but we don't need a system so complex that it discourages people to invest.

d. Restore IRA for all taxpayers, allow a full \$2,000 deduction for a homemaker spouse: I support incentives for savings and investment, like the IRA. I am a cosponsor of Finance Committee chairman Roth's bill to provide new back-ended IRA and expand traditional deductible IRAs.

We should increase the income limits on taxpayers eligible to contribute to an IRA and allow non-working spouses to make full IRA contributions.

I also unveiled a new pension plan called the SIMPLE -- the Savings Incentive Matched PLan for Employees. It would allow small employers to set up a pension plan without all the administrative hassle. Employers and employees could each contribute up to \$6,000 tax-free, without the cumbersome nondiscrimination rules that prevent so many small employers from offering a pension plan to its employees.

- e. Restore deduction for state and local sales taxes:
 Repealed in 1986. Iowa has a fairly high sales tax of about 5%, raised recently from 3%. This should be reevaluated in the context of overall tax reform efforts.
- f. Restore charitable deduction for nonitemizers: Should be reexamined in the context of overall tax reform efforts. Whether we like it or not, charitable giving it often influenced by taxes. All people who give to charities should be treated the same, whether or not they itemize.
- g. Repeal provisions that take away deductions and exemptions at certain income levels: These provisions add significant complexity to the tax system. When we reform the tax system, we should reexamine these back door tax increases.

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ESTATE TAX EXAMPLE

If a taxpayer owns a family business that is worth \$2 million, upon his death he can leave the business to his children and \$1.5 million of the business is exempted from the estate tax. Of the excess \$500,000, only one-half of it is taxed. Therefore, instead of paying the estate tax on \$2 million, at a 55% marginal rate, the tax is paid on \$250,000.

If a family business is owned by a husband and wife, they can each exclude \$1.5 million for their estates before leaving the business to their heirs.

We understand that the Ways and Means Committee is considering . proposals to dramatically change and reduce the federal program to promote the domestic production and use of fuel ethanol. In the face of America's dangerous and increasing reliance upon foreign sources of energy, it is ill-advised to undermine one of the few bright successes in our fight for energy independence.

As reported, these proposals are so proscriptive, they bring into question our commitment to a regulatory reform agenda. Dictating who can produce, how much can be produced and sold into which markets, embraces the command and control tools of a typical planned economy that our party opposes.

Moreover, the irony is that these proposals could actually <u>increase</u> federal expenditures! The reason is simple: our ethanol incentives create a domestic market for our farmers that results not only in larger farm income, but also fewer federal farm program expenditures.

Enclosed you will find a copy of a GAO report just completed which, concludes, just as did the GAO report in 1990, as well as analyses completed by the Department of Agriculture and others, that budgetary savings attributable to increased grain demand for ethanol more than offsets the outlays from reduced excise tax collections. In short, this latest GAO report states:

Using the Acreage Reduction Program levels projected under the current farm program, the elimination of the tax exemption for ethanol blends results in a net loss to the U.S. Treasury. from 1996 - 2000 of \$2.5 billion if ethanol use drops by 50 percent and \$5.4 billion if ethanol use drops 90 percent.

As you know, however, the use of the ARP masks the real effect of eliminating the tax incentive. An analysis, therefore, assuming no ARP, will give us a more precise measure of the adverse impact of eliminating ethanol incentives. GAO concludes:

With no ARP for corn, the losses to the U.S. Treasury would be

\$3.2 billion or \$6.3 billion, with 50-percent and 90-percent declines in use, respectively.

Frankly, industry experts familiar with ethanol production will consistently maintain that the loss of market to the ethanol industry would be at a minimum 90-percent.

While the increased cost to the federal government should be alarming enough, tampering with schanol incentives will additionally hurt farm income - not just for corn farmers, but also for wheat, barley, sorghum, and potato farmers. GAO concludes that loss of farm income could be as high as \$1.2 billion per year!

As you can therefore see, your decisions in Ways and Means can greatly compound the problems facing our House and Senate Agriculture committees in meeting their own reconciliation instructions, drafting a new farm bill, and at the same time minimizing the adverse impact on our family farmers.

Bill, we realize that since this GAO report was just recently completed, that you did not have the benefit of its findings. We urge you to consider the enclosed copy thoroughly, and to remove the proposed modifications to the ethanol tax program from your Committee bill.
