

Specifically, I would like to invite you to join us for the Gala Dinner with Senate Leadership on Tuesday, October 24, 1995, and make keynote remarks. This event will be the highlight of the conference. In addition to the several hundred Summit attendees and conference sponsors, members of the Washington community will also be invited to participate. As of this writing, a request is pending with the Speaker's office to use Statuary Hall as the site of the dinner. Should Statuary Hall be unavailable, another location nearby will be used.

I would also like to request that you host a small private reception and brief photo opportunity prior to the dinner in your Capitol office for the Summit sponsors. Your support and participation will directly impact the success of the Summit as well as to show the media that women are an important element of the GOP.

Attached is additional background information on the Women Leaders Summit. Democrats are convinced that women voters are the key to holding the White House and to stifling Republican legislative initiatives. The primary goals of the Summit are to help build support among women for the goals of the Republican-led Congress and to establish a stronger dialogue with women at a grassroots level.

**REPUBLICANS ARE FIGHTING TO  
GIVE, YOUR FAMILY, AND YOUR  
BUSINESS A MUCH NEEDED TAX CUT.
