SENATOR BOB DOLE
REMARKS

ARMENIAN ASSEMBLY BANQUET

THANK YOU, ALICE, FOR THOSE VERY KIND WORDS OF INTRODUCTION. IT WAS 48 YEARS AGO THIS YEAR WHEN I FIRST MET ALICE'S FATHER--BUT I REMEMBER IT LIKE YESTERDAY.

I HAD CONSULTED MANY

DOCTORS BEFORE I MET DR. KELIKIAN. THEY TALKED TO ME ABOUT NERVE DAMAGE AND IMPAIRED FUNCTION--BUT DID LITTLE TO DISCOURAGE MY SEARCH FOR "MAGICAL" SURGICAL PROCEDURES THAT WOULD RESTORE ME TO THE WAY I WAS BEFORE I WAS WOUNDED. I RECALL THAT DURING OUR FIRST MEETING, DR. K. ADMINISTERED THE VERBAL EQUIVALENT OF A SLAP IN THE FACE. HE WOULD DO ALL HE COULD, BUT THERE WOULD BE NO MIRACLES. "THE CHOICE IS ALL UP TO YOU," HE TOLD ME. I COULD EITHER FEEL SORRY FOR MYSELF, OR I COULD ACCEPT MY SITUATION, GET ON WITH MY LIFE, OF WHAT I HAD."

AND WORKING TO MAKE THE MOST OF WHAT HE HAD WAS THE STORY OF HAMPAR KELIKIAN'S LIFE. AS A BOY, DR. KELIKIAN ESCAPED THE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE, AND HE ARRIVED IN CHICAGO IN 1920 POSSESSING \$2 IN HIS POCKET AND A RUG FROM

HE LOST THREE ARMENIA. SISTERS IN THE GENOCIDE. HE GOT A JOB ON A FARM, WHERE HE IMPRESSED HIS EMPLOYER INTO PAYING HIS WAY THROUGH COLLEGE. HE THEN WENT ON TO MEDICAL SCHOOL AND AN APPRENTICESHIP AT COOK COUNTY HOSPITAL.

I WAS JUST ONE OF MANY

WHOSE LIFE WAS CHANGED BY DR. KELIKIAN. AND BECAUSE OF HIM, I HAVE ALWAYS FELT A SPECIAL CONNECTION WITH THE ARMENIAN PEOPLE.

ELIZABETH AND I VISITED
ARMENIA IN THE AFTERMATH OF
THE DEVASTATING EARTHQUAKE,
AND WE WERE INSPIRED BY THE
TREMENDOUS COURAGE OF THE

ARMENIAN PEOPLE--PEOPLE WHO WERE MAKING THE MOST OF WHAT THEY HAD.

IMMEDIATELY AFTER WE RETURNED TO THE UNITED STATES, ELIZABETH AND I BRIEFED THE PRESIDENT ON THE SITUATION IN ARMENIA, AND ADDITIONAL HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE WAS SOON ON THE

WAY.

AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE WILL CONTINUE TO FLOW TO ARMENIA. THANKS TO THE EFFORTS OF ALL OF YOU, EVEN IN A TIME OF DECLINING FOREIGN AID, WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO ENSURE ARMENIA WAS FULLY FUNDED. LAST NIGHT, A HOUSE-SENATE CONFERENCE APPROVED

THE HUMANITARIAN AID CORRIDORS ACT AS PART OF THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS BILL. THE SENATE PASSED THIS BILL LAST MONTH, FITTINGLY ON ARMENIA'S INDEPENDENCE DAY.

ENACTMENT OF THE
CORRIDORS ACT WILL HELP
ENSURE THAT AMERICAN
HUMANITARIAN AID CAN BE

DELIVERED WHERE IT IS NEEDED AND WHEN IT IS NEEDED. AND IT SENDS A MESSAGE TO THE **GOVERNMENT OF TURKEY THAT IT** CAN NOT ACCEPT AMERICAN FOREIGN AID, WHILE AT THE SAME TIME CLOSING ITS BORDERS TO DELIVERY OF FOOD AND MEDICINE ON ITS WAY TO ARMENIA.

FOUR YEARS HAVE NOW PASSED SINCE ARMENIA ACHIEVED ITS INDEPENDENCE FROM THE SOVIET UNION. AND PRESIDENT TER-PETROSSIAN IS NOW THE LONGEST-STANDING DEMOCRATICALLY ELECTED PRESIDENT AMONG THE FORMER SOVIET STATES.

THE ROAD TO DEMOCRACY

HAS NOT ALWAYS BEEN EASY. THE ARMENIAN PEOPLE HAVE WITHSTOOD THEIR BURDENS WITH STRENGTH AND COURAGE. PRESIDENT TER-PETROSSIAN KNOWS WHAT IT IS LIKE TO STRUGGLE UNDER TOTALITARIAN RULE. THE ARMENIAN PEOPLE HAVE HAD TO ENDURE TWO OF THE WORLD'S WORST MAN-MADE OF THIS CENTURY AT THE HANDS
OF THE OTTOMAN EMPIRE,
FOLLOWED BY SEVEN DECADES OF
SOVIET COMMUNISM. ONE OF
THE WORST NATURAL DISASTERS
WAS THE 1988 EARTHQUAKE.

LET ME JUST SAY A FEW WORDS ABOUT GENOCIDE.

BEFORE BEGINNING THE

HOLOCAUST, ADOLF HITLER SAID, "WHO REMEMBERS THE **ARMENIANS?" THAT IS WHY IT IS** IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER. THIS YEAR IS THE 80TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE. AFTER ARMENIA, IT WAS THE JEWISH PEOPLE. THE WORLD SAID, "NEVER AGAIN." THEN IT WAS CAMBODIA IN THE 1970S.

NOW, AGAIN ON THE EUROPEAN CONTINENT, IT IS BOSNIA. REMEMBERING THE PAST -- THE HISTORICAL TRUTH OF THE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE -- IS A DUTY WE OWE TO THOSE WHO DIED, TO THOSE WHO CANNOT REMEMBER. IF WE DO NOT REMEMBER THE ARMENIANS, THERE WILL BE MORE HOLOCAUSTS, MORE CAMBODIAS,
MORE BOSNIAS AND MORE
RWANDAS.

NO DOUBT ABOUT IT, THE
ARMENIAN PEOPLE HAVE MADE
SACRIFICES, AND MUST CONTINUE
TO MAKE SACRIFICES IF
DEMOCRACY IS TO SURVIVE. FEW
NEIGHBORHOODS ARE AS TOUGH
AS ARMENIA'S -- BLOCKADED BY

TURKEY, FACED WITH WAR ON TWO SIDES, AND PRESSURED BY THE RUSSIAN BEAR. AZERBAIJAN HAS OIL RESOURCES, TURKEY HAS NATO, IRAN HAS A NEW ISLAMIC INTERNATIONAL. ARMENIA ONLY HAS ITSELF AND THE SUPPORT WE CAN GIVE. BUT GIVEN WHAT I KNOW ABOUT ARMENIA AND ARMENIANS, THAT WILL BE ENOUGH.

AS I THINK ABOUT THE TREMENDOUS SACRIFICES ALREADY MADE THIS CENTURY BY THE ARMENIAN PEOPLE, I REMEMBER THE WORDS OF THE STATE MOTTO OF KANSAS--TO THE STARS THROUGH DIFFICULTIES.

I AM CONFIDENT THAT THE

PEOPLE AND GOVERNMENT OF
ARMENIA HAVE THE COURAGE
AND PERSEVERANCE THAT WILL
ALLOW THEM TO REACH THE
STARS.

STATEMENT OF SENATOR DOLE MR. PRIME MINISTER, MR. MAYOR, COLLEAGUES AND FRIENDS. WELCOME TO THE UNITED STATES CAPITOL FOR THIS HISTORIC EVENT. IT IS AN HONOR TO HOST A CELEBRATION FOR THE 3000TH ANNIVERSARY OF JERUSALEM. NO OTHER CITY ON EARTH IS TODAY THE

CAPITAL OF THE SAME COUNTRY, INHABITED BY THE SAME PEOPLE, SPEAKING THE SAME LANGUAGE AND WORSHIPPING THE SAME GOD AS IT WAS 3000 YEARS AGO. NO OTHER CITY ON EARTH HAS HELD SUCH A UNIQUE PLACE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF WESTERN CIVILIZATION. NO OTHER CITY

ON EARTH HOLDS SUCH
IMPORTANCE TO THREE GREAT
WORLD RELIGIONS.

APPROPRIATE THAT THE 104TH
CONGRESS HOST ALL OF YOU
FOR THIS INAUGURAL
CEREMONY. ALL OF US HAVE
SPECIAL MEMORIES OF THIS
MOST SPECIAL CITY. I FIRST

VISITED JERUSALEM ALMOST THREE DECADES AGO. I REMEMBER SPEAKING IN JERUSALEM IN 1977 -- FOUR SHORT YEARS AFTER THE TRAGIC 1973 WAR. I REMEMBER EASTER SUNDAY, 1990 WHEN I ATTENDED A SUNRISE SERVICE ON THE MOUNT OF OLIVES. IN ITS OWN WAY AND TO EACH OF

US, JERUSALEM IS UNIQUE. TODAY IS A DAY TO REFLECT ON THE HISTORICAL, THE SPIRITUAL AND THE PERSONAL IMPORTANCE OF JERUSALEM. FOR 3000 YEARS JERUSALEM HAS STOOD AS A SYMBOL OF PEACE AND OF HOPE. TODAY'S ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION STANDS AS A

SYMBOL OF OUR RESPECT FOR JERUSALEM. THANK YOU.
