PRESIDENT JORDAN, DR. ANDERSON, MEMBERS OF THE BOARD, FELLOW COMMENCEMENT SPEAKERS, DISTINGUISHED GUESTS, THE CLASS OF 1996 AND THEIR FAMILIES, I AM DELIGHTED TO BE HERE THIS AFTERNOON.

PRESIDENT JORDAN IS ONE OF MY HEROS, AND A MAN WHOSE ADVICE I COUNT ON.

AND TWO OF YOUR TRUSTEES, JOHN McCAIN AND STEVE GUNDERSON, ARE BOTH CLOSE FRIENDS AND BIG SUPPORTERS OF GALLAUDET.

AS I WAS LOOKING OVER A LIST OF PREVIOUS COMMENCEMENT SPEAKERS, I NOTICED THAT PRESIDENT GARFIELD WAS THE FIRST PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES TO SPEAK AT A GALLAUDET GRADUATION.

MY GOOD FRIEND STROM THURMOND JUST HAPPENED TO BE THERE AND TELLS ME PRESIDENT GARFIELD GAVE AN EXCELLENT ADDRESS.

AS YOU KNOW, IT HAS BEEN THE HONOR AND DUTY OF EVERY PRESIDENT SINCE ULYSSES S. GRANT TO SIGN THE DIPLOMAS OF GALLAUDET GRADUATES.

I HOPE TO HAVE THE HONOR OF SIGNING GALLAUDET DIPLOMAS NEXT YEAR.

GALLAUDET--A TRADITION OF LEADERSHIP

LET ME BEGIN BY THANKING YOU FOR THE HONORARY DEGREE -- WHICH I HOPE YOU WILL ALLOW ME TO REGARD AS AN HONORARY MEMBERSHIP IN THE GALLAUDET COMMUNITY.

IN FACT, AS I WAS COMING OVER HERE, I WAS THINKING THAT WE COULD SETTLE THE QUESTION OF WHETHER ENGLISH SHOULD BE THE OFFICIAL LANGUAGE OF THE U.S., BY AGREEING ON A COMPROMISE -- MAKING "AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE" THE OFFICIAL LANGUAGE.

I KNOW ASL WOULD BE A BIG, BIG IMPROVEMENT IN THE SENATE -- MY COLLEAGUES THEN WOULD ACTUALLY HAVE TO PAY ATTENTION TO EACH OTHER DURING DEBATES!

ALL OVER THE WORLD, GALLAUDET IS KNOWN FOR ITS LEADERSHIP IN THE DEAF COMMUNITY.

I WAS PROUD TO VOTE TO CONFER UNIVERSITY STATUS ON GALLAUDET IN 1986, AND TODAY I WANT TO REAFFIRM MY COMMITMENT AND SUPPORT FOR THIS GREAT UNIVERSITY.

AS YOU KNOW BETTER THAN MOST, JUST EIGHT YEARS AGO, THE STUDENTS OF GALLAUDET FOUGHT FOR RECOGNITION OF THEIR WORTH AND FOR EQUAL OPPORTUNITY BY DEMANDING A DEAF PRESIDENT.

TOGETHER WITH MILLIONS OF AMERICANS, I WATCHED WITH FASCINATION AS THE EVENTS OF THAT WEEK IN MARCH UNFOLDED.

IN FACT, EVEN BEFORE THE CONTROVERSY BEGAN, I WROTE TO THE TRUSTEES, URGING APPOINTMENT OF A DEAF PRESIDENT. TO ME, IT WAS JUST A MATTER OF COMMON SENSE.

IT CAN BE TRULY SAID THAT GALLAUDET EDUCATES NOT ONLY ITS STUDENTS, BUT THE REST OF THE WORLD AS WELL.

AND GALLAUDET HAS HELPED EDUCATE ME AS WELL.

MESSAGE TO THE CLASS OF '96

I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE A MOMENT TO SPEAK TO THE MEN AND WOMEN OF THE CLASS OF 1996.

CONGRATULATIONS ON THIS SPECIAL DAY. YOU WILL NOW GO FORTH TO A WORLD WHERE YOUR OPPORTUNITIES HAVE NEVER BEEN GREATER, AND THE EXPECTATIONS FOR YOUR SUCCESS NEVER HIGHER.

NEW COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGIES INCREASINGLY ALLOW DEAF PEOPLE FULL PARTICIPATION -- ON THEIR OWN TERMS.

FOR EXAMPLE, SENATOR McCAIN AUTHORED TITLE IV OF THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT, WHICH PROVIDES FOR TELEPHONE RELAY SERVICES.

NO DOUBT ABOUT IT, TELEPHONE RELAY SERVICES ARE ONE OF THE UNQUALIFIED SUCCESSES OF ADA.

AND ONE CAN HARDLY OPEN A NEWSPAPER OR TURN ON A TV WITHOUT HEARING ABOUT THE INTERNET -- THE WORLDWIDE HOOK-UP OF THOUSANDS OF COMPUTERS.

FOR THE PRICE OF A LOCAL PHONE CALL, ONE CAN GO TO WORK, RETRIEVE INFORMATION, SEND E-MAIL, OR EVEN CHAT WITH SOMEONE --- ALMOST ANYWHERE ON THE PLANET.

THE INTERNET CAN ALSO BE A UNIQUE BRIDGE BETWEEN THE HEARING AND DEAF WORLDS -- WHERE EVERYONE MEETS ON EQUAL TERMS.

BUT ALL THESE TECHNOLOGICAL MARVELS, ALL THE COMMUNICATION BREAKTHROUGHS, ARE ONLY TOOLS.

YOUR SUCCESS WILL BE DETERMINED BY YOUR CHARACTER.

TECHNOLOGY DOESN'T IMAGINE, COMPUTERS DON'T ASPIRE, MACHINES

DON'T DREAM.

TO REALIZE YOUR FULL POTENTIAL, YOU MUST BE STRONG AND SELF-RELIANT, AND ASSUME THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF LEADERSHIP.

YOU WILL BE TESTED -- OFTEN IN DEMANDING, UNEXPECTED WAYS.

I HAVE SOME EXPERIENCE WITH THAT MYSELF. DURING WORLD WAR II, WHEN I WAS 22, I WAS INJURED IN COMBAT.

FOR A YEAR I COULD NOT WALK, AND SOME THOUGHT MY LIFE WAS FOREVER LIMITED.

I REFUSED TO ACCEPT THEIR JUDGEMENT. YES, I LIVE WITH A FEW INCONVENIENCES, BUT THEY ARE JUST THAT, INCONVENIENCES.

I SUSPECT YOU HAVE HAD SIMILAR EXPERIENCES.

AND AS YOU ARE ALSO TESTED -- EACH IN YOUR OWN WAY -- YOU MUST NEVER GIVE UP OR ACCEPT SECOND BEST.

IF ONE PATH SEEMS BLOCKED, FIND ANOTHER.

AND IF I EVER BE OF HELP TO YOU, PLEASE LET ME KNOW.

MY MOTHER USED TO SAY, "CAN'T NEVER COULD DO ANYTHING."

HER MEANING TO US WAS CLEAR. A POSITIVE ATTITUDE HELPS GET THE JOB DONE, BUT A NEGATIVE ATTITUDE STOPS YOU EVEN BEFORE YOU TRY.

PERHAPS THE BIGGEST TEST, THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE, IS LEADERSHIP. GALLAUDET HAS PROVIDED EXCELLENT ROLE MODELS -- SUCH AS DR. JORDAN, DR. GANNON, AND DR. DAVILA.

WE NEED LEADERS WHO WILL SUMMON FROM EACH OF US THE BEST OF OUR CHARACTER.

LEADERSHIP MEANS YOU ARE IN THE ARENA, MAKING YOUR VOICES AND SIGNS HEARD AND SEEN, LEARNING FROM OTHERS, AND HELPING GET THE JOB DONE.

AND LEADERSHIP IS A WAY OF GIVING SOMETHING BACK FOR THE OPPORTUNITIES YOU HAVE HAD.

WE NEED YOUR LEADERSHIP -- IN BUSINESS, IN CONGRESS, IN ALL WALKS OF LIFE.

AND I THINK WE ARE PAST DUE FOR A DEAF PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES!

RE: BACKGROUND TO GALLAUDET SPEECH

The speech was written with nuances of the deaf and Gallaudet communities in mind. Some specific items:

- Apart from the Garfield joke being funny, President Garfield was a big supporter of Gallaudet and is beloved on campus.
- The official English/American Sign Language joke was suggested by Cong. Gunderson--ASL is very popular on campus (lots of debate within deaf community on best flavor of sign language, etc.).
- A copy of your 1988 letter to the Trustees recommending a deaf President is attached. The letter was sent two weeks before the Gallaudet Presidency controversy even began.
- Many deaf students don't consider themselves "disabled," and regard deafness as an "inconvenience." That view is referenced in the speech.
- Drs. Gannon and Davila, referred to in the speech, will be on the platform with you. Gannon is a longtime staff member who is retiring; Davila is a former Assistant Secretary of Education who is receiving an honorary degree.

Dear Mr. Brann (BRAVIN)

It is my understanding that Gallaudet University is in the process of choosing a new President. I also understand that, after an arduous recruitment and screening process, you have identified six finalists who are highly qualified for the position, three of whom are deaf.


I do not wish to intrude in your process of choosing the best candidate. You are selecting an individual who will be deciding on the direction of Gallaudet University for several years to come, and you certainly want the person who is most qualified to do that. But I have listened to the hearts of the deaf community, and I hear the same message that you do. There is strong desire that the University hire a President who is highly qualified but who is also deaf.

Gallaudet University is held in very high esteem by the deaf community. It has and continues to provide a future for thousands of people who are now leading productive lives and contributing to society with more than their taxes. It is more than a school for them, it is a home. They care about the University and its future in the same way you cared about their's. They see the University as the leader and expect it to show the way as it always has.

Ten years ago you and I were concerned about employment for graduates of the University. Gallaudet was in the forefront in changing attitudes and coordinating employment opportunities. But increased awareness among the general public has helped that situation tremendously. I do not mean to suggest that all discrimination against deaf persons has been erased, only that the condition today is different. Deaf individuals own and operate their own businesses, and we have a deaf actress who has won national acclaim for her work.

Deaf individuals are moving into positions of public notice and public responsibility and becoming role models for deaf students who can see and admire them and dream. Isn't it time for the University to once again lead the way instead of following it and place a deaf individual in a position of public responsibility.

Appearance of a name in this program is presumptive evidence of graduation, but it must not in any sense be regarded as conclusive. The diploma of the University, signed and sealed by its proper officers, remains the official testimony of the possession of the degree.

About Commencement:

The Gallaudet Dance Company

At its spring performance, the Gallaudet Dance Company dedicated the show to the late Dr. Peter Wisher, who founded the company in 1955. Currently the company is directed by Dr. Diane Hottendorf, and Ms. Sue Gill-Doleac, a former Gallaudet dancer, is assistant director of the company.

Graduating today are Ms. Kirstin Ostgaard from Missouri and Ms. Maya Yamada from Canada; both are receiving master's degrees in deaf education.

Today the company will perform the following dances:

"Greenfields," choreographed by Dr. Peter Wisher and performed by Ms. Star Carr, Ms. Kirstin Ostgaard, and Ms. Maya Yamada.

"I'm a Brass Band," choreographed by Mr. Bob Fosse, restaged by special graduate student Ms. Ruth Rosen, and performed by Ms. Star Carr, Ms. Roxanne Dummett, Ms. Stephanie Johnson, Ms. Tara Miles, Ms. Dawn Porter, and Ms. Brenda Rosario.

"The Lesson of Love," choreographed and performed by Mr. Warren Snipe, a former Gallaudet dancer and an admissions counselor for Gallaudet University, and Ms. Maya Yamada, the company's graduate dance intern and the assistant coordinator of the National Deaf Dance Academy.

Invocation and Benediction

The Reverend Dr. Val Dively has been the part-time Assemblies of God chaplain with Gallaudet University's Office of Campus Ministries since 1990. She occasionally serves as a Deaf guest preacher at Deaf congregations with different denominations in Maryland. She also has been a full-time faculty member with the University's Department of American Sign Language, Linguistics, and Interpretation since 1990. Born deaf, Dr. Dively grew up in Michigan and graduated from the Michigan School for the Deaf in 1977. She received a bachelor's degree with triple majors in English, education, and psychology in 1982 and a master's degree in deaf education in 1984 from Gallaudet University. She earned her doctoral degree in linguistics, with subspecializations in anthropology and translation studies, this past January at the Union Institute.

The National Anthem

"The Star-Spangled Banner" has been translated by Professor Emeritus Gilbert C. Eastman. Directing "The Star-Spangled Banner" is Dr. Rita Corey, assistant professor, assisted by Mr. André Pellerin, technical assistant in the University's Theatre Arts Department.

Our signers graduating today are Ms. Barbara Durham from Illinois, majoring in deaf education—multiple disabilities, and Mr. Jason Maloney from California, majoring in business.

The soprano soloist is Ms. Mary E.J. Walker. Ms. Walker, who has been employed by Gallaudet since 1983, is currently the secretary for Construction Services. Having sung with church and community choirs and choruses since the age of 13, Ms. Walker studied vocal music at Southern University, where she was a vocal student of Mrs. Frances Marsh-Ellis. She is a member of the Mass Choir at Temple Church of God in Christ in Washington, where she is president of Kelsey's Kids' Children's Choir and directs the Male Chorus.

Student Speakers

Ms. Sherry Bradley, who will receive a bachelor's degree in elementary education, grew up in Akron, Ohio, a member of the fourth generation in a deaf family. Her accomplishments include being named to the Dean's List for nine semesters, nomination to *Who's Who Among Students*, awards in soccer, tennis, and softball, and winning a gold medal for her basketball skills at the World Games for the Deaf. In 1995 she broke the basketball scoring record at Gallaudet University. Ms. Bradley, who is a member of the Delta Zeta Sorority, the Bisonettes Club, and Kappa Delta Pi, was Miss Deaf Ohio from 1993-1995 and is the reigning Homecoming Queen at Gallaudet University. Currently in an accelerated program to receive her master's degree in deaf education at Gallaudet University in May 1997, she hopes to teach deaf elementary school students and pursue a Ph.D. in education.

Ms. Sybil Smith-Gray, the first graduate of the doctoral program in clinical psychology at Gallaudet University, earned a bachelor's degree in psychology and a master's degree in deaf education from the University of Texas at Austin. After teaching for several years at the Texas State School for the Deaf, she earned a second master's degree in educational psychology from Ohio State University. Ms. Gray has lectured and studied at the Kinderzentrum, Munchen in Munich, Germany. Her accomplishments include winning an Individual Research Award from the National Institutes of Health and the Larry Stewart Outstanding Student in Clinical Psychology Award. Ms. Gray is the coordinator of Community Outreach Clinical Services at Georgetown University Medical Hospital Child Development Center. She is a mother, wife, daughter, daughter-in-law, sister, and friend.

The Academic Costume

The pageantry and dress of the academic procession have been inherited from the medieval universities of the 11th and 12th centuries. In the Middle Ages, the teaching guild was the guild of the master of arts, the bachelor was the apprentice of the master, and their dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility.

Principal features of academic dress are the gown, the cap, and the hood. Since the 15th century, Cambridge and Oxford have made academic dress a matter of university control. American universities agreed on a definite system in 1895. In 1932 the American Council on Education presented a revised code that is in general use today. Occasionally, uniquely colored costumes may be seen that do not conform to standard patterns. This is true for degrees granted by foreign universities or from American universities that have adopted European style.

The Gown: While 12th century gowns may have been worn as protection against the cold of unheated buildings, today the gown is symbolic of the democracy of scholarship. It is black for all degrees, with pointed sleeves for the bachelor's degree; long closed sleeves with a slit at the elbow or wrist for the master's degree; and full, bell double sleeves for the doctoral degree. Doctors' gowns are also faced with velvet and have three bars of velvet on each sleeve, often in the color distinctive of the faculty or discipline to which the degree pertains.

The Cap: Today's mortarboard is a derivation of the cap worn in the 16th century at the University of Paris. The soft velvet cap of a "doctor of secular faculties" is from the same period. Bachelor's and master's degree holders wear tassels of black, while doctoral degree holders wear tassels of gold.

The Hood: The hood is trimmed with one or more chevrons of a second color on the ground of the primary color of the college. The color facing the hood denotes the discipline represented by the degree. Certain hood colors have historical significance. The white of arts and letters symbolizes the white fur trim of the Oxford bachelor of arts degree. Red, the traditional color of the church, indicates theology, while the royal purple of the King's Court signifies law. The green of medicinal herbs identifies medicine, and blue—the color of wisdom and truth—identifies philosophy.

The Honor Stole: The honor stole is awarded to students with a 4.0 (straight A) grade point average. This gold satin stole denotes exceptional academic achievement.

The Mace

The mace that is carried by the faculty marshal as a symbol of the University's authority made its first ceremonial appearance at the installation of the fourth president of Gallaudet College. In a sense, it has existed longer than the University. It is made of the wood of three buildings historic in the education of deaf people. The largest piece is taken from the old interior stairway of the Tower Clock on the Gallaudet campus. Another piece comes from the oldest building on the campus of the American School for the Deaf in Hartford, Conn., which is itself the oldest school for deaf students on this continent.

The smallest piece of all is a piece of plank from the wall behind the pulpit of a small 16th century church in Feuges, France, that was served by the Abbé Charles Michel de l'Épée. Historians recognize him as the founder, in Paris, of the oldest free school for deaf students in the world.

The late Leon Auerbach, '40, a former faculty member who represented Gallaudet and deaf people of the United States at the 25th anniversary of l'Épée's birth, is responsible for bringing the plank to this country. When he and his wife visited Feuges to see the church, they found it in the early stages of restoration supported by the deaf people of France. The church's present vicar gave the plank to Professor Auerbach as a gift to Gallaudet from the old world to the new.

The mace was designed by Chun Louie, '68, a Gallaudet photographer. It was made by Manfred G. Klatt, a Gallaudet carpenter who learned cabinet making in Germany, where he was born. The decorative silver and silver support for the head of the mace were made and applied by Theodore Salazar, an assistant professor in Gallaudet's Art Department.

The President's Medallion

The president's medallion was presented for the first time on October 23, 1969, to a Gallaudet president. Meant to be worn on ceremonial occasions, it symbolizes the authority of that office. The medallion was redesigned in 1986 to coincide with Gallaudet's achievement of university status and shows the seal of Gallaudet University.
