
Dear Bob,

This is just a note to tell you that in a long conversation I had with Al Sindlinger last week, he spoke in very glowing terms of a meeting he had with you and several of the members of your staff.

During my years in the White House, I found that while many of his colleagues among economic experts tended to discount his predictions, he was more often right than wrong. I think it would be very much in your interest to keep in touch with him. I hope, incidentally, that his pessimistic outlook on the immediate economic prospects prove to be inaccurate. But I must admit that I am deeply concerned about the negative impact the economy can have on the November election. Unless we get an upturn in September and October, I think we are in for a pretty rough time.
