There are about 3,000 A.S.T.P. men here and they are really taking it out on us. They believe that we have had a soft life for the last 3 months so they are either going to make us or break us. I'm in the infantry attached to an Anti-tank outfit but until I can learn more about it I can't explain what it is.

and out of the fire it has rained 2 nights and threatened to the rest of the time. I haven't caught cold yet and I'll watch myself so don't worry about it.

This outfit is a little tougher than the medics but at least we have something to fight back with. They are giving us "Carbine" rifles and the Anti Tank company also ~~car~~ is equipped with 57 m.m. guns, which are big and powerful.

I have passed out only in 15 minutes so its time to stop now. Don't worry about my A.P.O. number, every combat unit is given one when they are on maneuvers. After maneuvers are over I will have a permanent address.

No chance for furlough for ~~me~~ some time now, sorry I didn't get home to see "Bitch", maybe I'll

get a furlough someday!!

Tomorrow is an easy day so I
may have time to write. I'm one A.S.T.P.
boy they're not going to break, so don't
worry about me, I even sort of
like the place.
