I hadnt heard the news about Vernon London before, certainly its too bad. People never realize how bad the war is until it hits that close to home. I talked to Mr. London when I was home and he told me that Vernon was almost finished.

Im still not sure of Kennys address, I couldnt make out "Moms" writing on part of it, the next time you send it, print it so I can make it out.

Glad to hear that Harold is married. I think hes met his wife, though Im not sure.

Hoping that I get one of the packages soon and also all the back mail that I should have coming. Ill write more tomorrow - Bob.
