My promotion from second to first Lieutenant
was a result of being in grade as a second Lieut.

18 months. However, I had been recommended for that
promotion prior to being wounded, but for some unknown reason I never received it. Consequently, I
didn't receive it until I had been in grade 18 months.

Due to the fact that I had been recommended prior to
being wounded, and since I have affidavits to substantiate the fact, I still think that I am entitled
to a promotiom under provisions of WD Cir 215.

I am writing my old Bn. CO. for a letter, you have one from my former Company Co., but perhaps another would be of some help. If I can further establish the fact that I was recommended prior to being wounded, and if I can definitely find out what ever happened to that recommendation, I should stable be
