Dear Mom and Dad:

I really like this new place although it's plenty rough or rather it has been the last 2 days.

Yesterday we spent the entire day creeping and crawling and I'm still pretty sore and stiff. My elbows and knees are sort of skinned up.

The ground is so hard down here that it's just like crawling on a sidewalk. We practiced crawling in and out of fox holes, under barbed wire and through rocks and grass. In about 6 weeks we have to crawl 150 yards with machine guns firing 40 rounds alone on heads. You can see that we have to stay pretty low for if we ever raised up it would be our last time. Today we marched 8 miles in an hour and forty-five minutes. It was really

hot and 40 fellows out of 200 fell out or passed out. Most of them were fellows 30 years old or older though.

I'm a guide now, my job is to lead our platoon of 63 men. It's a lot of fun and I hope I'm good enough to keep the position. One thing nice about being at the front the officers and non coms can see you easily and if you do a good job it's all the better for you.

Had a letter from Grace today. and she's getting along O.K. according to her letters. I haven't had time to write her up till now so I must do it tonight.

In the 6<sup>th</sup> we wear dress shoes and I think we can wear garrison caps.

Saw Kenny a while tonight, he gets 3 shots tonight so I imagine his arm will be too sore to write. I've had 6 shots and I have only one more to take.

Had a letter from Grace today and she was pretty mad

at me for not writing her last week.  
I wrote to her and tried to explain  
to her that I was too darn busy to  
even turn around last week. I hope  
she understands.

Thanks a lot for the #5, I really  
don't need it though; but I guess I  
can save it. We got #25 now and  
we get paid tomorrow for some so  
I'll have plenty of ready cash. If  
I have any shorts around there you  
might send them to me and I  
would like some stamps too if  
you would get me some. I never  
have time here and I would like  
to write a special delivery letter now  
and then. Get me some 10 cent  
special delivery stamps and some  
3 cent stamps, please. If I don't  
have time to write Gladys tonight  
you call her and thank her for the  
house shoes. They're really nice and  
I wear them every night. Tell her  
to buy Keeney size 10 for his feet are  
a little bigger than mine.

Sounds like you will fly the  
house up. I'd like to be home to see  
it one of these days.

Dad what do you want for your  
birthday? There isn't much I can get  
you in camp, but I'll try to think  
of something.

I doubt if you can read this  
I'm writing it on my bed for we  
have no tables in our huts.

Tell everyone hello for me and  
take it easy.
